

Tornado To Have 30 Men in 6 A-1 Meet

Ron Peery, mainstay in the outfield on the Medford High baseball team, switches to track Saturday when the defending champion Black Tornado cinder and field squad goes to Grants Pass for the annual District 6 A-1 meet.

Peery has not heaved the spear in competition this spring but is rated among contenders for a state meet berth.

Crater High, Klamath Falls and Ashland will have teams in the meet along with Medford and the host Cavemen. From 125 to 150 athletes are expected to be on hand for the bids for spots in the state A-1 meet next week end at Corvallis. Grants Pass, a power all spring, is figured to unseat Medford for district honors and to gain the most berths for the Corvallis encounter.

Crater Enters 25

Coach Dean Benson has listed a Medford squad of 30 for the GP trek. At Crater, Coach Ed Knapp has announced a crew of 25.

Preliminary events are slated for 11 a.m. tomorrow with finals beginning at 2:30 p.m. Medfords best bets for first places are Mike Russell in the quarter-mile, Bruce Hill in the half-mile, George Koch in the broad jump, and Mike Murray in the shot put. But Tornado thinclads also are considered to have good chances for state meet spots in the mile, relay, high jump, javelin and pole vault.

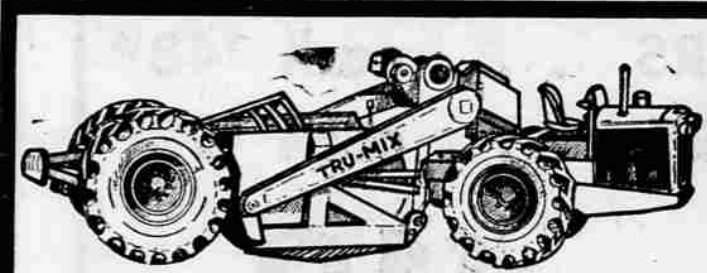
Their 10-rounder will be televised and broadcast nationally.

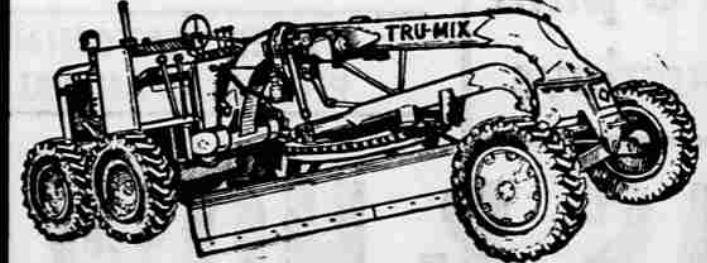

PCC Track Meet Gets Underway

Eugene — (AP) — Mark Robbins, ace Oregon two-miler, is suffering from a throat infection and will miss the Pacific Coast Conference track and field championships at Berkeley this week end.

Berkeley — (AP) — The mighty Trojans of southern California, nationally supreme in track and field for most of the time during the last quarter century, went after their 17th win in the last 18 years in the Pacific Coast conference meeting opening at Berkeley today.

With world record holder Charley Dumas in the high jump and the great Rink Bakka in the discus leading the way, coach Jess Mortenson's crew isn't expected to have too much trouble.

Most of the major conflicts are scheduled for Saturday. The only competition for the Trojans is expected to come from Rafer Johnson, who'll be competing for UCLA. The decathlon star is entered in eight events: both sprints, both hurdles, the shot put, broad jump, discus and javelin. However, it is probable that he'll not compete in more than four. He has a good chance to win in three: the high hurdles, javelin and broad jump.

Bowden Skips Mile

Some of the shine has been taken off the mile run with the announcement that Don Bowden, Cal's 3:58.7 runner, will skip that event and compete only in the half mile and the relay. If he runs in the half, he'll have plenty of opposition, with Norm Llyd of Stanford having a better time this year at 1:49.2. Bowden has a 1:49.8; and Ernie Culliffe of Stanford has 1:50.2.

There are five conference champions defending. These are: Terry Tobacco, Washington, in the 440; Bowden in the half; Max Truex of USC, a virtual cinch in the two-mile; Bob Lawson, USC, in the high and low hurdles; and Rink Bakka of USC, who'll be competing for his third consecutive crown in the discus.
