

# Lary Hurls Detroit To To 3-2 Victory Over New York Yankee Team

Frank Lary, who appears to be regaining his old mastery over the New York Yankees, hurled Detroit to a 3-2 victory over New York Saturday to slow down the Yankees' headlong rush toward another American league pennant.

The Tigers' win snapped a nine-game losing streak — and a 10-game Yank winning streak. Both skeins had been the longest in the major leagues.

In other A. L. games, Walt Dropo's eighth-inning homer gave the Chicago White Sox a 4-3 victory over the Baltimore Orioles. The Washington Senators scored six runs in the eighth inning to beat Cleveland, 6-3; and a ninth-inning error by Billy Hunter helped the Boston Red Sox beat Kansas City, 5-4.

Shortstop Daryl Spencer's eighth-inning error started the Milwaukee Braves on their way to a four-run rally that enabled them to defeat the San Francisco Giants, 6-3, Saturday.
