Italian Hot Lips Plans Western Role

Hollywood — (UPI) — Rosano Brazzi, only Italian screen lover to flutter feminine hearts since Rudolph Valentino, plans to forego his hot-lips roles to star in a western.

Don't laugh. Brazzi starred in 35 Italian horse operas before Hollywood ever heard of him.

"It's true," the handsome Italian exclaims. "In Italy we call cowboys 'Butteri.' I spent more time with the horses than leading ladies. We have much beef there."

"Our cowboys lead the same life as American cattle-men," he continued. "Of course, we have no cattle rustling. Italians just rustle chickens."

Lover Roles Boring

The graying star of 20th Century-Fox's "South Pacific," added, "I am bored with playing the great lover. In Italy, I am considered an actor, not a matinee idol."

"My countrymen are funny," he said. "When I play villains in American movies they don't like it. They feel it hurts Italian prestige. They think I should play a South American or a Frenchman if I am going to be a heavy."

"Now that I have played both good men and villains, I want to do comedy — a western satire."

Brazzi's success in American movies wasn't an overnight occurrence.

Hollywood Flop Recalled

"I came to Hollywood ten years ago and was the biggest flop in history," he said. "I played the father in 'Little Women.' They put heavy makeup on me, including a beard. When I saw the picture, I was shocked."

Parity Plan Urged By Wheat Grower

Washington — (UPI) — Floyd Root, president of the national Association of Wheat Growers, urged Congress today to adopt a "domestic parity plan" to bring commodity supplies into balance and develop a long-range farm program.

Root, a Wasco, Ore., wheat grower, told the senate agriculture committee his organization backed the price support program worked out by the National Conference of Commodity Organization last December. The plan is supported by the National Grange, but opposed by the administration and the American Farm Bureau.

He said the plan would "move all wheat on a free open market at an open market price and return to the producer, through the use of marketing certificates, full parity of his share of the wheat consumed domestically for food."

The plan actually is not a "two price" scheme, he said, because the farmer would sell all his wheat at the prevailing price for the quality grain he has produced. He would not certificates to assure parity prices only on his individual share of the domestic food market.

Portland Presbytery Moderator Succumbs

Portland — (UPI) — Dr. Leonard Odiorne, 49, pastor of the Westminster Presbyterian Church here and moderator of the Portland Presbytery, died Sunday at Peoria, Ill. The family here said death was due to a heart attack.

Dr. Odiorne had been in Portland since 1950.

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Congressman Will Check Up On Trujillo Jr.

Washington — (UPI) — A Republican congressman served notice Tuesday he is not going to let Lt. Gen. Rafael Trujillo Jr. graduate from a U. S. Army school if he plays hooky too much. At least, not without the public getting an earful about it.

Rep. Charles E. Brownson (R-Ind.) teed off on the fact that young Trujillo, given a leave of absence from the Fort Leavenworth, Kan., Army command school to have his tonsils removed, went to Hollywood to "rest up" afterward.

While in Hollywood he lavished gifts of expensive fur coats and foreign cars on native American and imported movie queens, despite the fact that he has a wife and six children back in the Dominican Republic where his father is president.

Brownson indicated he doesn't think this kind of conduct would help an American officer graduate from the Leavenworth school. He said he was disturbed by reports that foreign policy considerations sometimes play a bigger role in deciding who graduates than grades and attendance.

The congressman said he will demand a full list of grades and attendance records of foreign officers who are graduated from the school next month.
