Portland—(UPI)—Relatives were advised Tuesday that a Portland woman who had gone to Canada to attend her brother's funeral was killed in an automobile accident Monday night.

The victim was Mrs. G. D. Radke, about 52. Her husband was injured and was hospitalized at Vulcan, Alberta, about 60 miles southeast of Calgary, George Russell, a brother of Mrs. Radke, also was slightly injured. The family had driven to Claresholm, Alberta, to attend the funeral of Mrs. Radke's brother, Joseph Russell, last Saturday.

Usual Fanfare Scheduled For Three TV Networks

New York — I've been looking over the tentative fall schedules of the three networks and I find they contain the usual fare—Westerns, situation comedies, quizzes.

Frankly, the situation disturbs me. But I don't think the season has to fall into the same old rut—a few new program ideas would fix things up fine. In the interests of better programming, therefore, I have compiled the following possible formats for TV shows next September:

"The Places Show"—I see

this as a one-man assisted by one Atlas type show. The idea is for him to call out places—Minneapolis, Detroit, Tiffin, Ohio; Chavez Ravine; Kanda Kanda, Belgian Congo—and then let the studio audience applaud. That's all.

"The Awards Show"—an entry that would take care of all the trophies, plaques, medals, statues, certificates, ribbons, decorations, garlands, crowns, citations, honors, titles, cups, saucers and gold records ordinarily bestowed upon performers each week on their own programs.

"The Coming Attractions Theatre"—This one would be a drama show made up of all those scenes played at the end of "Playhouse 90," "Climax" and "Studio One" that capsulizes what's coming up the following week. They're usually the best part of the upcoming script anyhow.

"The Vaughn Monroe Show"—one half-hour of Monroe dropping radios.

"The Plug Show"—in which stars would parade on the stage to puff their latest movies, books, plays and to make jokes about commercial products that aren't their sponsors'. I see Bob Hope as emcee.

"The Sound Track Show"—made up of the greatest canned laughs from filmed situation comedies.

"The Egghead Show"—Italian and Japanese movies.

"The Sugar-Egghead Show"—Italian and Japanese movies with French titles.

"The Postcard Show"—a once-a-month entry in which

all the home participation quizzes like "The Price is Right," "Dotto" and "Treasure Hunt" select a viewer to whom they can send all their used postcards.

"The Horror Show"—made up entirely of stomach acid commercials.

"The Break-Up Show"—Helen Traubel roaring at Eddie Fisher who has muffed his lines after watching Steve Allen giggle when Sid Caesar coughed as a result of Frank Sinatra mumbling under his breath in Italian because Patti Page forgot the words to an introduction. I should explain that it was all caused by Perry Como who misread his cue cards.

"The Stars Strike Back Show"—in which TV critics poke their heads through a 21-inch hole while performers throw typewriters at them. I see this as a spectacular.

Coulee Dam City Sale Underway

Coulee Dam — (UPI) — The federal government Monday began selling the city of Coulee Dam, which has been under federal control for more than 20 years.

Residents of the town which lies below Grand Coulee dam on both sides of the Columbia river, will be given first priority on purchase of residential and commercial property.

Postmaster Clarence Sears was the first to buy his home in the federal sale. That sale was handled by P. R. Nalder, Columbia basin project manager for the reclamation bureau.

The Federal Housing Administration has appraised the homes at \$1,500,000, while individual prices range from \$1200 to \$11,000.
