Every Sixth Alcoholic: A Woman in Her Forties

I always look through that interesting little magazine, the "Cloud Chaser," which is published by the Alcoholics Anonymous group in the Minnesota State reformatory. They recently had a conference on alcoholism in women, at which Dr. Jackson A. Smith, of the Nebraska Psychiatric Institute, and Dr. Frederic Boyce, of the San Francisco Adult Guidance Center, reported that most alcoholic women are about 40. They have been drinking for about eight years, and many have been divorced. One in six alcoholics is a woman.

According to Mrs. Mary Clark, of the California chapter of the National Alcoholics committee, there are three types of women who are "problem drinkers." One is the "party-goer" who next day brags about how tight she got. Then there is the woman who keeps mourning over the death of her husband or a child, and seems to be trying to commit suicide with alcohol. Finally, there is the "respectable matron," who seems normal to most persons. Close associates, however, know that every so often she goes on a bender.

The point few people know about these women is that in practically every case, if one inquires carefully to the family, one will find relatives who are alcoholic or mentally depressed or sometimes epileptic, or sometimes just unstable. Many alcoholic women are unusually gifted and interesting persons. Many are artistic, and many write well. Some get divorced and remarried a half-dozen times, but, as one would expect each husband soon loses his respect for the woman and soon afterward his love.

Dr. Ellis D. Sox of San Francisco, told the conference that many of these women can hardly be cured. They go to a physician only "when their liver is shot," and they have a cirrhosis. For many of these

women life has been one long succession of dissatisfactions, failures, griefs, and admissions of failure. Many of them crave love, but they are too self-centered to give much of it; many cannot give it even to their children, and their neglect of their children fills them with feelings of guilt.

Most Back Pains Are Cured Without Surgery

At the recent annual Congress of Industrial Health, in Milwaukee, Dr. Ralph K. Ghormley, of the Mayo Clinic, one of America's great orthopedists, said that an early operation for relief of back pain is indicated only when there are signs of increasing pressure on a nerve root, with perhaps weakness of a muscle in a leg or persistent pain in a leg, or limited motion in the spinal column due to tense muscles.

A New Artificial Muscle

I read now that a sort of mechanical muscle for use in artificial hands has been invented by an experimental physicist, Dr. Joseph L. McKibben, of Los Angeles, New Mexico, working with Dr. Vernon L. Nickel, Jacqueline Perry and Roy Snelson, of Los Angeles. The apparatus was demonstrated recently at a conference held in New York City. It is not yet available, but it is hoped that it will soon be made in quantity. The essential part of the apparatus is a tube containing a helically-woven nylon tube. When, by slight pressure on a valve, carbon dioxide under pressure is allowed to enter the tube, the nylon contracts like a muscle, and causes an artificial thumb and forefinger to come together forcibly.

One Type of Cancer Controlled

Dr. John R. Heller, Director of the National Cancer Institute of Bethesda, Maryland, reports what may be a "definite break-through in chemotherapy (treatment with drugs) research." There is a rare cancer of women called a chorio-carcinoma. In 1956, Drs. Roy Hertz, M. C. Li, and D. Spencer found that this tumor could sometimes be controlled by a chemical called methotrexate. Six out of the 16 women treated so far appear to have been cured. Discoveries like this are so hopeful because it gives the research men a lead to follow. They can now keep modifying the drug in a hundred or more

Increase Asked For John Day Dam

Washington — (UPI) — Army Engineers have asked congress to approve an increase in the appropriation for John Day dam to cut the construction time by three to five years.

Approval of the new Engineer schedule would put John Day power on the line in October, 1966, three years ahead of present time tables. The navigation lock could be completed in August, 1961, five years ahead of schedule.

Warehouse Shutdown Ends in Seattle

Seattle — (UPI) — The four-week-old shutdown of the city's major grocery and produce warehouses ended Tuesday night when members of General Truckers' Local 174 of the Teamsters union voted to accept the latest contract offer by the Northwest Produce association.
