Says Alaska Bill Has Good Chance

San Francisco — (UPI) — Sen. William F. Knowland believes the Alaska Statehood bill has an even chance of passing in the Senate.

Knowland, Republican candidate for governor, arrived Thursday to wind up his campaign and to vote next Tuesday.

"I'm for statehood for both Hawaii and Alaska and we hope to get assurances from the Democratic leadership that they will bring up the Hawaii bill also," he said.

The house approved the Alaska bill on Wednesday. He said there may be a move "to tie the Hawaii bill onto the Alaskan measure."

Submarine Suffers Second Accident

Honolulu — (UPI) — The submarine Stickleback, rammed amidship by the destroyer escort Silverstein, sank to the bottom of the Pacific ocean Thursday night but all 82 crewmen escaped.

No one was injured on either vessel.

The Silverstein knocked a four-foot hole in the Stickleback's pressure hull frame about 1:30 p.m. during naval maneuvers. The Stickleback later surfaced and tied up alongside the destroyer.

First radio reports from the doomed submarine said the forward battery and control room were flooded. Another message said the Stickleback had a 20-degree list to port and a downbow of 15 degrees.

But the submarine surfaced on its own power and the crew transferred to other vessels which sped to the rescue.

The repair ship Greenlet began towing the submarine back to drydock at Pearl Harbor, but at 7 p.m. the Stickleback turned over and slipped beneath the waves.

An immediate investigation was started to learn the cause of the collision, second major accident involving the Silverstein in the past week. Last Wednesday, a locker full of depth charge launcher cartridges exploded aboard the Silverstein, injuring five crewmen.

Drivers Licenses Suspended Listed

Salem — The department of motor vehicles has released names of 441 drivers whose licenses were ordered suspended during the period beginning May 19 and ending May 23.

Length of suspension varies, depending on charges involved, recommendation of court, discretionary action by the department of Oregon law. The department said some of the licenses involving financial responsibility and court recommendations may have been reinstated after suspension was ordered.

The department warned drivers that the penalty for driving while suspended is a jail sentence of no less than two days and up to six months, and there may be imposed a fine up to \$500. Under licensing procedures, this will also result in an additional year of suspension.

False Testimony Charges Brought

Hollywood — (UPI) — Restaurateur Steven Crane, ex-husband of film star Lana Turner, has been accused of giving false information to a coroner's jury at the time it was investigating the fatal stabbing of Johnny Stompanato.

An affidavit filed by Attorney William J. Pollack Thursday claimed that Crane was in error as to what time he was called to the actress' home after their 14-year-old daughter, Cheryl Crane, stabbed Stompanato last April 14.

The document is in opposition to a motion by Crane to dismiss himself as a defendant in a \$750,000 suit brought as a result of the death of the underworld lothario, Cheryl and Miss Turner also were named in the action.

Pollack recalled that Dr. John M. McDonald testified at the coroner's inquest that he was called to the Turner residence in nearby Beverly Hills at "approximately 9:50 p.m."

Crane said he was called by his daughter at "around 9 o'clock."
