The Medical Roundup

THE PATHOLOGIST. A good pathologist must be an extremely able physician because he has to know every detail about what goes wrong in a body when serious disease attacks it.

In a great institution like the Mayo Clinic there are at least three groups of pathologists. One group studies the tissues of people who have died. They perform autopsies, and in studying the diseased organs and tissues, they contribute enormously to our knowledge of medicine.

In a fine teaching institution over 30 per cent of the persons who die will be autopsied. When a loved one passes on, it is good when the nearest of kin gives permission for an examination of the body.

When a relative of the patient should fall ill, the fact that his loved one died of a rare hereditary disease may throw great light on his or her trouble, and may enable the doctors to make a diagnosis and work a cure.

A second type of pathologist found in a big clinic works in a laboratory close to the operating rooms. He is constantly reporting on what are known as "biopsies."

There is yet another type of "clinical pathologist" who usually is in charge of a laboratory with a number of technicians working with him. They are the ones who examine blood and urine and feces, and who measure the basal metabolic rate with any one of several techniques.

Today, much of the work of the clinical pathologist is in the field of the chemistry of the blood. Tissues, body fluids, throat smears, blood urine, sputum, spinal fluid and other substances are studied chemically and bio-
