

Report Said To Contribute Nothing To Refute Kidnaping of De Galindez

New York—The report by lawyers Morris Ernst and William Munson, released Sunday, has contributed nothing substantial to refute the theory that Dr. Jesus D. Galindez was kidnaped by agents of Dominican Dictator Trujillo and flown from Long Island to the Dominican Republic, via Florida, by Gerald Murphy, a free-lance American flier. According to this week's issue of Life magazine, the Ernst-Munson investigation does not alter the disappearance on the same night that Murphy, after weeks of preparation and after working with a convicted

agent of the Dominican Republic, headed on a long flight southward. Investigation Retraced The magazine notes that the Ernst-Munson paper attempts to retrace Life's investigation. "It delves into every step minutely, but the result never disproves Life's story. In many ways it substantiates it." Life says that if the allegations of its theory were unjust "as hinted and not proved by the Ernst report," Espallat and Trujillo are welcome to come to the U.S. and sue for libel. Evidence of Trujillo's Role In Kidnaping Claimed Lacking

New York (UPI)—A noted U. S. attorney has reported he found no evidence in a 10-month investigation to support charges that the government of Dominican strongman Gen. Rafael L. Trujillo was involved in the mysterious disappearance of Dr. Jesus D. Galindez two years ago. The attorney, Morris L. Ernst, general counsel for 26 years to the American Civil Liberties Union, was employed by Trujillo to make the investigation after widespread accusations that De Galindez had been kidnaped and slain by Dominican agents. Last Seen in 1956 De Galindez, a Spanish exile who once worked for Trujillo and had become his acknowledged political foe, was last seen entering a subway near Columbia University, March 12, 1956. He had been an instructor at the university and had recently completed a doctoral thesis there in which he charged the Trujillo regime with more than 100 political assassinations. Ernst's report suggested that De Galindez' disappearance may have been connected with his financial operations as an agent for the

Basque government-in-exile, theory officially advanced by the U. S. State Department which connected the late American pilot Gerald Lester Murphy with the disappearance of De Galindez. Smuggling Charged Murphy, 23, was slain in the Dominican Republic in December, 1956; it was later reported that he had flown De Galindez from New York to the Dominican Republic. Ernst said he had received reports Murphy actually was engaged in smuggling arms into Cuba on the day he was said to have been flying De Galindez to the Dominican Republic.

Reservists May Get Vet Pension

A new law makes provision for a reservist drawing non-disability retired pay for military service to receive Veterans administration compensation or pension if he waives an equal amount of his retired pay. S. T. Brannock, officer in charge, Veterans administration office, Medford, said today. The law, which is widely misunderstood by retired reservists and other interested persons, is Public Law 85-376 which became effective May 1. Under previous laws, the waiver privilege was open to all retired members of the regular armed forces, but to reservists only if they were retired for physical disability, Brannock stated. The new law now gives equal waiver privileges to all veterans receiving retired pay for either regular or reserve military service. Brannock emphasized, however, that reservists must be otherwise eligible for compensation or pension to take advantage of the waiver. Second Cover Needed for Moth

The second cover spray for control of codling moth, psylla and mites on pears should be completed by June 12, according to Dr. L. G. Gentner of the Southern Oregon Experiment station and C. B. Cordy, county horticultural agent. In speed sprayer, growers should use eight pounds of 50 per cent DDT plus three pounds of Aramite per acre. Kelthane is used on Comice pears. In hose rigs, recommendations are for 1 1/2 pounds of DDT plus 1/2 pound 50 per cent Dieldrin plus 1 1/2 pounds Kelthane or Aramite per 100 gallons. Apples should be sprayed with 12 pounds of 50 per cent DDT per acre or two pounds per 100 gallons. If aphids are present, six pounds of parathion per acre or one pound per 100 gallons is recommended. Addition of 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 X-77 spreader per 100 gallons should be used.
