Pacifists Plan Another Try

Honolulu — (UPI) — Crew members of the nuclear protest yacht *Golden Rule* planned to cast off today in their second government-defying attempt to sail to Eniwetok.

At the same time, other steps were being taken in hopes of making the pacifists' goal successful.

From Los Angeles, Attorney Abraham Lincoln Wirin said he was preparing an application that, if passed, would eliminate the temporary injunction preventing the *Golden Rule* from sailing.

Meanwhile, another protest yacht was being made ready. Earle L. Reynolds, skipper of the yacht "Phoenix" and a former member of the Atomic Energy commission, cabled President Eisenhower and the AEC urging them to lift the ban that prohibits entering of the nuclear testing area.

Reynolds then added: "The Phoenix will sail from Honolulu in the near future, clearing for the high seas." He indicated that the high seas he mentioned were the waters surrounding the Marshall islands.

ILLINOIS VALLEY Charcoal Kiln Destroyed

Cave Junction — An early morning fire Monday completely destroyed the largest kiln at the Jiggs Morris charcoal plant.

The origin of the fire, which burned undetected, is unknown. Morris stated he had worked for four hours in the kiln Sunday and there was about a ton and a half of charcoal still in the kiln when it burned.

The damage amounted to approximately \$2,500. The cement walls are crumbled, the scales warped and the metal roof was almost completely melted. As late as Monday afternoon the remaining charcoal in the kiln was a white hot mass.

The fire did not spread, probably due to the heavy rainfall of Sunday night and Monday morning. Morris said a new kiln would be built immediately.

Former Legion Chaplain Dies

San Francisco — (UPI) — Father John Edward Duffy, Bataan "Death March" survivor and former national chaplain of the American Legion, died today in Letterman Veterans' hospital at San Francisco's Presidio. He was 58.

Duffy recently served as pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes Church at New London, Ohio. He came here in April to visit friends.

He entered the hospital at Fort Ord April 13 and was transferred to Letterman two days later.

Duffy was one of the heroes of the infamous "Death March" following the American surrender to Japan in the Philippines. He was bayoneted and left to die, but was saved by Filipino guerrillas.

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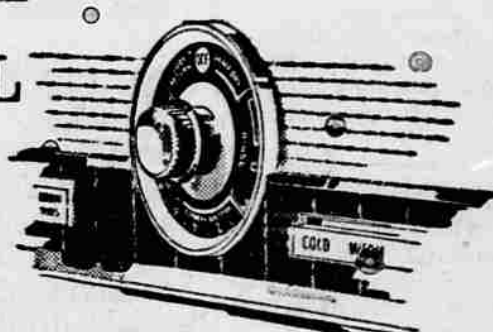


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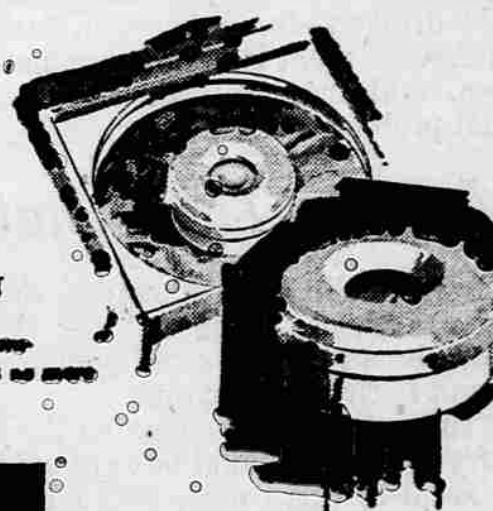
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
