

Senator Neuberger Sees Nothing Wrong In Wife Modeling Swimming Suit at Party

Washington—That was no cheesecake model, that was my wife modeling a bathing suit—and what's wrong with it?



This, in effect, is the attitude of Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore.) to "a few critical letters" he said he has received this week because Mrs.

Neuberger last week posed in a swimsuit at a Democratic fund raising party here. A picture of her in the outfit went out over the Associated Press network and

appears in this week's Time magazine, which characterizes her as "leggy." In his weekly newsletter, Neuberger gives Maurine space to answer the critics. Called "Improper"

The critics said it was "improper," he said. One suggested that this is the sort of cheesecake photography that is corrupting the morals of the youth. But we have had many favorable letters, especially from people connected with the manufacture and sale of clothes in Oregon," the newsletter said.

The Commerce Department, it pointed out, reported that 12 million swimming suits were sold during 1957.

"If it is permissible for all these women to wear bathing

suits, then it is equally right for the wife of a senator to do so," said Maurine. "Just because my husband is a member of the Senate, I refuse to believe I am different from, or better than, any other American female."

She added that Oregon sends out tourist literature showing bathing girls and she would

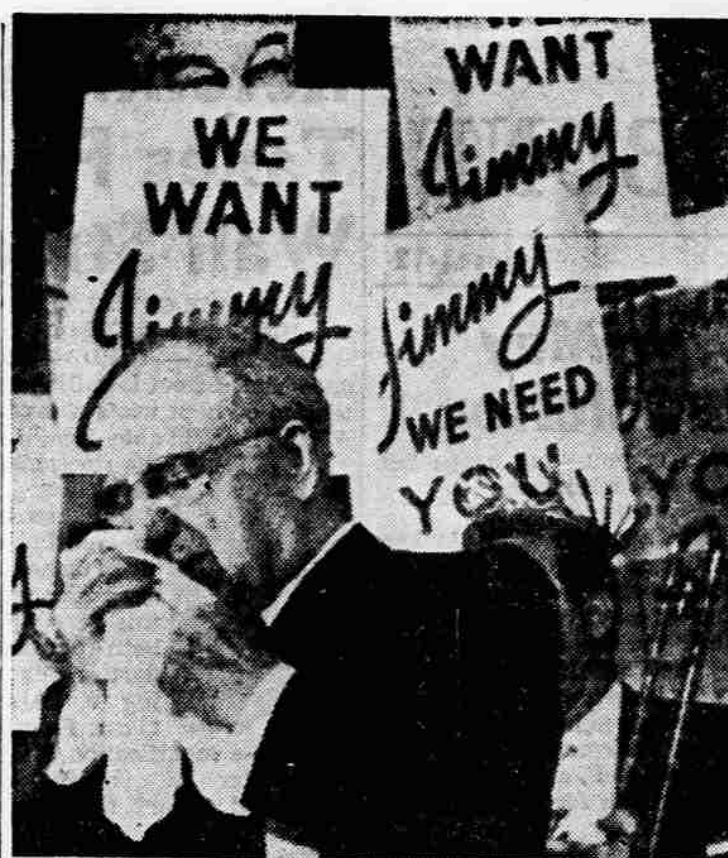
hate to think what was good "to lure Oregon's visitors" "wasn't regarded as 'discreet' for the wife of one of Oregon's senators."

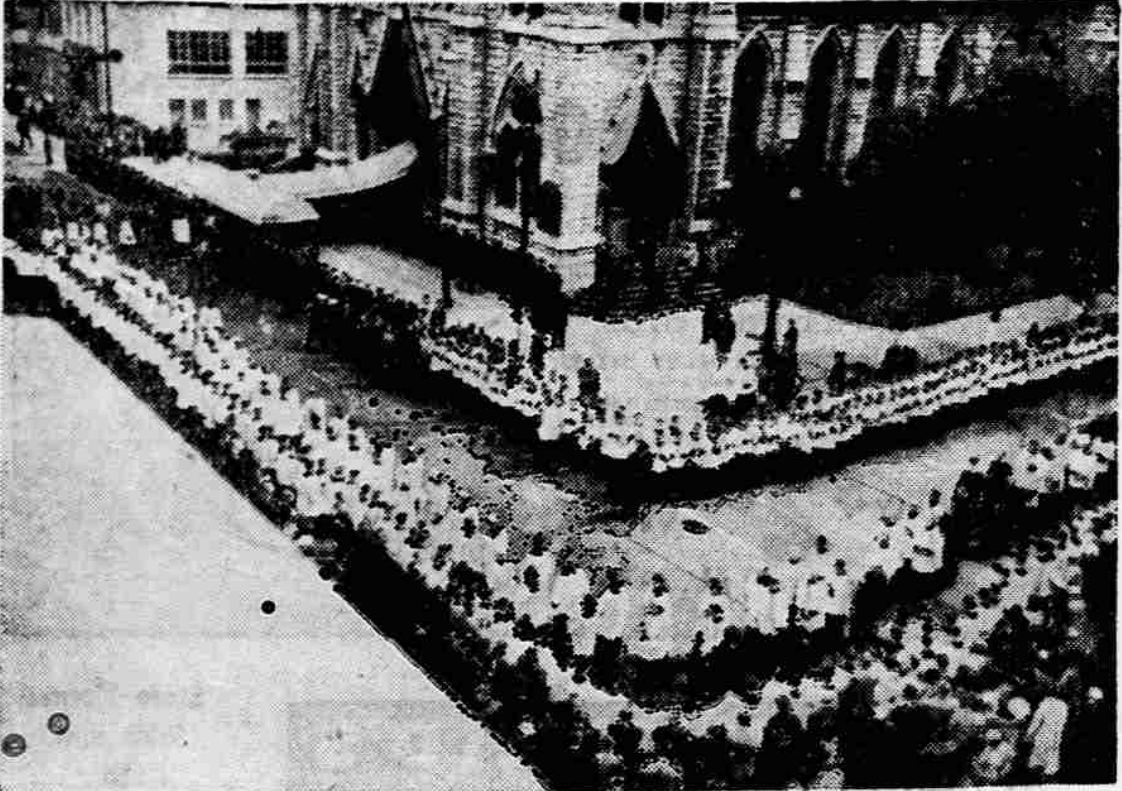

Graham Terms Crusade Crowds As Phenomenal

San Francisco —(UPI)—Evangelist Billy Graham says attendance at his San Francisco crusade has been "phenomenal."

Addressing members of the general committee at a luncheon in San Mateo Wednesday, Graham said the crusade has been "successful beyond our anticipation."

"Before we began this crusade in April, I said we would be fortunate indeed to get 10,000 people a night to drive out to the Cow Palace."

"I don't like to place a lot of emphasis on attendance, but in San Francisco it has been phenomenal. Our smallest crowd was last Tuesday when we had 9,000 people. I guess most any minister would be thankful for a congregation of 9,000."

Graham also said more people have come forward to dedicate their lives to Christ than in any crusade he has conducted, with the single exception of New York. The number of conversions so far is 18,283 of a total attendance of 524,100.

Wednesday night, 9,500 persons heard Graham preach on "How to Lead a Christian Life." Graham said Christian life in the United States is this country's "greatest paradox."

Highest Membership
"We have the highest church membership in our history with more than 100 million Americans belonging to churches or synagogues."

"We also have increasing racial tension, one of our greatest crime waves, rising divorce rates and a growing problem of juvenile delinquency."

"What's wrong? The church itself. The average church member is not living the Christian life and his church is not teaching him how to do it. The greatest need in America today is a revival within the church."
