**Thor Nearer Overseas Use**

Camp Canaveral, Fla.—(UPI)—Firing of an intermediate range Thor from a launcher of the type to be used by field units brought the Air Force closer today to having the missile ready at overseas bases by the end of the year.

Elmer P. Wheaton, chief missiles engineer for the Douglas firm which builds the Thor, called Wednesday's firing "another major step in the rapid development of weapons systems."

The 65-foot Thor blasted off at 1:17 p.m. (PST.) It made a steep climb into the blue sky, its 150,000-pound thrust rocket engine trailing a compact teardrop of flame and

**Coquille Plywood Plant Sale Told**

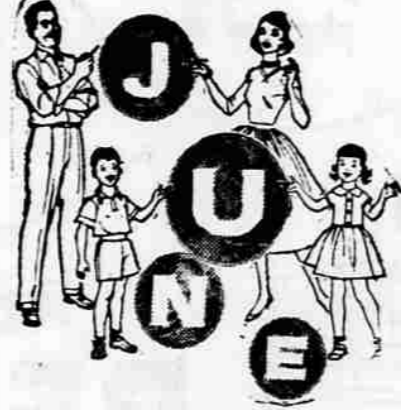
