Girl, 13, Enables Police To Catch Eugene Gunman

Eugene (UPI) — A Eugene grocery store proprietor was wounded in a holdup attempt Wednesday, but thanks to the alertness of a 13-year-old girl, two suspects were arrested less than two hours later some seven miles west of Eugene on Highway 38.

Carl August Ehrich, 62, proprietor of Ehrich's Family Market here, told police a dark-haired man with a crew cut pulled a gun on him pointed to the till and said "This is a holdup."

Ehrich said "I'm not going to give you anything." The gunman fired one shot that crashed Ehrich's left temple, then ran out to a parked car and raced away.

Girl Heard Shot
Mary Ann McFarland heard the shot, saw the man run to the car and drive away. She got a description of the car and the license number, ran into the store and called police.

Acting on her information, state police arrested a man and woman at a steakhouse about seven miles west of Eugene, which is about 40 miles south of Eugene.

State police who returned the two to Eugene said they first gave the last name of Smith but later were identified as Richard Eugene Founts, 27, and his wife, Pat Ann Founts, 20, both of Long Beach, Calif.

Ehrich was treated at a Eugene hospital.

Boys Playing on Raft Drown in Pond

Rainier, Ore. (UPI) — Two brothers playing on a raft drowned in a pond at Delena near here Wednesday.

The victims were Lowell Sams, 13, and his brother, Clifford, 12.

The mishap occurred in a small pond near a house. The two brothers were last seen paddling their raft toward shore.

A search began when the father, Larry Sams, a millworker, returned home shortly after 3 p.m. and found the boys' clothing on the bank of the pond. The bodies were found in six feet of water about three hours later.

The victims had two sisters and a younger brother.

Crude Oil Imports Ordered Extended

Washington (UPI) — President Eisenhower Wednesday ordered the so-called voluntary import quotas on crude oil extended to cover unfinished gasoline and oil.

The president approved the move upon recommendation of a special committee on crude oil imports headed by Commerce Secretary Sinclair Weeks.

The action was designed to prevent the circumvention of the quotas on crude oil imports.

ROSSELLINI VS. BERGMAN
Rome (UPI) — Annulment proceedings of Swedish actress Maria Bergman and Italian director Roberto Rossellini were in recess again today until June 30. The proceedings were opened Wednesday but were adjourned after Rossellini's lawyers reiterated their arguments that Miss Bergman's first marriage to Swedish Doctor Peter Lindstrom was not dissolved according to Swedish law when she married Rossellini.

Education To Be Discussion Topic

Portland (UPI) — Educators, school board members and about 90 laymen representing 13 states will meet at Timberline Lodge June 19-21 to discuss "Quality Education — A Citizen Responsibility."

The meeting is sponsored by the National Citizens Council for Better Schools.

The 13 states represented will be from the Council's western region. Western region chairman is Gardner Knapp, past president of the Oregon School Board Association.

Headline speaker for the three day session will be Palmer Hoyt, editor and publisher of the Denver Post.
