

## Special Workshop Set at SOC During Summer Months

Ashland — College summer session students have the opportunity of taking a special language-arts workshop from Miss Marian Zollinger, supervisor of language-arts in the Portland school system, Dr. Bill Sampson, Southern Oregon college summer sessions director, announced.

Beginning June 16, the two-week workshop is available to both elementary and secondary teachers, and will cover problems and methods in selecting and organizing materials for teaching in the subject field. To help prospective enrollees in planning their schedules, Dr. Sampson directed attention to the change in the dates as the workshop was originally scheduled for July 14-25.

Dr. Sampson explained that emphasis for graduate students would be placed upon recent research and literature dealing with instructional materials, methods, and facilities, including the completion of a special project.

Though registration for the regular session does not take place until Monday, June 16, it was pointed out that the workshop in language arts would begin June 9 and conclude June 20. Those interested are asked to contact the registrar as soon as possible.

## No Bargaining Progress Reported By Auto Union

Detroit — (UPI) — The United Auto Workers today scheduled negotiating sessions with General Motors, Ford, Chrysler and American Motors, but there was no bargaining progress to report.

After meetings at General Motors and Ford Wednesday — the first since contracts expired last week end — reliable sources told United Press International the parties were as far apart as ever.

The half-million auto workers at General Motors, Ford and Chrysler worked their third day without a union contract Wednesday and no incidents of labor trouble were reported. The GM contract expired last Thursday, the Ford and Chrysler contracts expired Sunday.

The UAW reported its members supporting the union's determination to work without a contract until the companies will agree to better unemployment benefits, pensions and job security protection. The UAW is not striking because the companies have a surplus of unsold new cars.

Extension Agreed — American Motors and the UAW have agreed to extend their contract if it expires on June 15 without a new settlement. General Motors, Ford and Chrysler, all offering the union a two-year renewal of the old contracts, refused to extend those contracts while negotiations continued.

## Portland Policeman Guilty of Burglary

Portland — (UPI) — A jury Wednesday found Warren L. Moore, 33, West Linn, a former Portland policeman, guilty of burglary. Sentencing was set for next Monday.

Moore was one of three Portland policemen arrested in connection with the burglary of Nordics' Appliance store Feb. 22. The other two have pleaded guilty and received 18-month prison terms.

## Cover Spray Given For Moth Control

Second cover spray for control of codling moth, peylla and mites on pears should be completed by June 12, according to C. B. Cordy, county horticultural agent.

In speed sprayers, 8 pounds of 50 per cent DDT plus 3 pounds of 50 per cent Dieldrin plus 8 pounds of Kelthane or 8 pounds of Aramite per acre should be used. Kelthane should be used on Comise.

In hose rigs, 1½ pounds of DDT plus a half pound of 50 per cent Dieldrin plus 1½ pounds of Kelthane or Aramite per 100 gallons should be used.

On apples, 12 pounds of 50 per cent DDT per acre or 2 pounds per 100 gallons is recommended. If aphid are present add 6 pounds parathion per acre or 1 pound per 100. This will also control leaf miner.

Add 1½ to 2½ ounces X-77 spreader per 100 gallons, Cordy advised.

## Rivers-Harbors Approval Expected

Washington — (UPI) — Sen. Arthur V. Watkins (R-Utah) believes Congress soon will pass a compromise rivers and harbors bill acceptable to President Eisenhower.

"Everything now points toward ultimate adoption of this compromise measure," he told a Senate Public Works Subcommittee Wednesday.

The group is trying to hammer out a new bill that would meet objections Eisenhower raised when he vetoed the original measure earlier this year.

Watkins said the President probably would favor the revised bill because many "questionable" projects of the earlier one have been "pruned out."

But Robert E. Merriam, deputy budget director, testified the bureau still objects to several hotly disputed projects in the new bill.
