### Central America Quake Recorded

Pasadena, Calif. — (UPI) — Seismographs at the California Institute of Technology today recorded a major earthquake at a distance of 2,900 miles southeast of here, laboratory director Dr. Charles Richter announced.

Dr. Richter said the quake had a magnitude of 6.7 on the Richter Scale, strong enough to do major damage if its center was in a populated area. The distance and direction would place the quake somewhere in Central America, he said.
