Copper Stockpile Proposal Claimed Being Considered

Washington—(UPI)—Sen. Mike Mansfield (D-Mont.) said today the government is giving "very active consideration" to his proposal that 150,000 tons of surplus copper be purchased for stockpiling. If accepted, the action would probably remove copper from the price support plan for minerals which Interior Secretary Fred A. Seaton recently submitted to Congress. Mansfield told United Press International that he outlined his plan to Seaton in a letter last week. He also sent a copy to C. Douglas Dillon, undersecretary of state for economic affairs. Both agencies are actively studying the proposal and a decision is expected soon, the senator said. U. S. officials confirmed that resumption of copper stockpiling is one of the ideas

Riddle Woman to Get Degree After Driving to School

Eugene—One of the University of Oregon students who will graduate this week has spent more on gasoline than tuition payments, according to Don Robinson of the University of Oregon news bureau. She is Mrs. Evelyn Mann, wife of a Riddle, Ore., contractor, who for the past three years has driven daily to Southern Oregon college, Ashland, or the University of Oregon in Eugene to attend classes. Mrs. Mann has a daughter in Riddle High school and a son, Richard, who was graduated from SOC two years ago. He will teach sixth grade at Canyonville this fall and Mrs. Mann will take a job teaching English in the seventh and eighth grades at Riddle Junior High school, three blocks from her home. She will drive the 101 miles to Eugene Sunday, June 15, for commencement exercises. Her grade point average of 3.8 is close to a straight "A" average. Mrs. Mann said she began extension college courses following a dare from her son and finally enrolled at Southern Oregon college, making the 91-mile trip to Ashland every week-day. Tugboat Strike At Coos Bay Ends

Coos Bay—(UPI)—A strike against five Coos Bay tugboat firms ended Thursday after agreement was reached on a new contract between the firms and Local 17 of the International Organization of Masters, Mates and Pilots. The new contract granted a reduction in the number of hours to be worked for a guaranteed month's pay to 86 from 140. Union members, on call 24 hours a day, will be required to work 172 hours a month for the same pay if called upon. Previously it was 180 hours. The agreement also called for two weeks' vacation after three years instead of five years.
