What Brings a Coronary Heart Attack?

In a recent article, Drs. H. I. Russek and B. L. Zohman, of New York State, made a study of 100 persons who, early in life had a coronary heart attack, and compared them with another 100 persons who did not have any such trouble. The persons studied were all between the ages of 25 and 40. The doctors concluded that there were three main predisposing factors which led to the coming of a heart attack early in life.

One was a diet rich in fat. More than half of the men who had had a heart attack loved to eat large amounts of fat, while only 20 per cent of the control group were similarly inclined. Heredity was a definite factor, as all insurance men know. A history of disease of the heart and arteries in one or both parents was obtained in 67 per cent of the patients with heart disease as compared with 40 per cent in the control group. But doctors go on to say that a man is not necessarily doomed because there is much heart disease in his family. There are other factors which are under his control. Interestingly, in the cases of 17 per cent of the patients with early heart disease, both parents were living and in good health, in their later years—this suggesting that their arteries were good.

Severe emotional strain of occupational origin, was recorded in 91 per cent of the patients with heart disease, and in only 20 per cent of the normal controls. Usually the patient with a heart attack was found to be an aggressive, ambitious person who had lived hard, and up to the limits of his strength. This is probably why heart attacks are more common in top executives than in clerks.

Curiously, overweight did not appear to be an important factor. Some experts have admitted recently that they had no real statistical proof that obesity is a factor; while others did present some

proof. Another unimportant factor seemed to be the amount of exercise that a person took. Heavy smoking of tobacco was a definite factor. Among the persons with heart disease there were more smokers and more heavy smokers than in the normal group.

Good News for the Diabetic. In a recent article, Dr. Paul de Kruif notes that although it is true that no diabetic whose disease began before he was 20 is likely to be a candidate for the new medicine that is taken by mouth, one in four of those who get their diabetes between the ages of 20 and 40 may be helped by the new drug. Occasionally, doctors are surprised to find a person with even a severe type of diabetes whose disease can be controlled with the pills. For patients who get their diabetes late in life, as so many do, about 80 per cent are able to take the pills.
