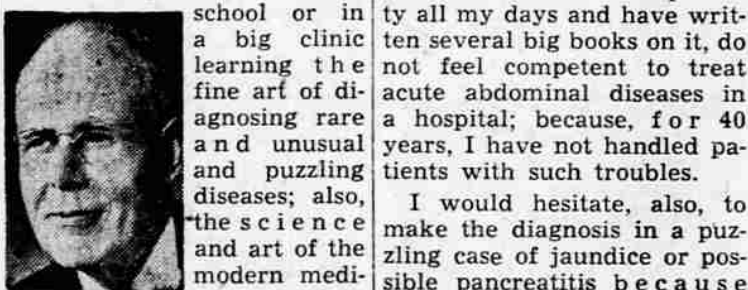

The Medical Roundup

Training An Internist

The young physician who decides to be an internist usually will spend his post-intern year as a "resident" in a big hospital, working on the "medical" side of the institution. After this, he will spend probably three years working in a graduate medical school or in a big clinic learning the fine art of diagnosing rare and unusual and puzzling diseases; also, the science and art of the modern medical treatment.

After these three years the doctor will be entitled to take his National Board examination and to become a "diploma" Then, and only then, after 12 long years of study, can he call himself a specialist. But, even after this, he may decide to specialize more narrowly, perhaps in cardiology (heart disease) or gastroenterology (diseases of the stomach and intestines), and again, he may have to take an examination and receive another diploma.

After that, if the man is going to be a fine consultant physician, he must keep on studying, reading each month at least a half-dozen medical journals, and perhaps teaching in his spare time in a hospital or clinic or medical school. Many an able specialist, for much or all of his life, gives gratis a part of his time to working for the poor in the free clinic of some university or hospital. Few people realize when their child's hairlip or defective hip joint is beautifully repaired by a great surgeon, or the child's very puzzling fever is diagnosed and cured by an eminent pediatrician, how much of the man's experience and skill were acquired while treating hundreds of children in a free or part-pay clinic.

Specializing Within Speciality

Many a specialist, and especially the man who works in a big clinic to which come each year thousands of patients, specializes within a specialty. For instance, at the Mayo Clinic, some men specialize in diseases of the mouth, while others are particularly interested in diseases of the gut, or ulcers of the stomach and duodenum (bowel just outside the stomach.) Other men study diseases

of the liver, diseases of the gall bladder, diseases of the pancreas (the large digestive gland behind the stomach), diseases of the colon, and diseases of the rectum.

Today, there is so much to be known about just one division of medicine—such as gastroenterology—that I, who have studied this specialty all my days and have written several big books on it, do not feel competent to treat acute abdominal diseases in a hospital; because, for 40 years, I have not handled patients with such troubles.

I would hesitate, also, to make the diagnosis in a puzzling case of jaundice or possible pancreatitis because these diseases I seldom see. My particular field has been that of the diagnosis of chronic digestive troubles and especially those of nervous or psychic origin.

Many persons criticize us doctors for specializing so much, but we cannot help ourselves. I cannot possibly keep up-to-date on what I must know about the diagnosis of people with very puzzling and bizarre abdominal discomforts, and at the same time know all about passing a lighted tube down into the stomach or about spearing a sample of tissue out of a diseased liver. I cannot know much about the many diseases of the rectum.

One of the delightful features of working in a large clinic is that every one of the physicians can so easily call a colleague into his room and say, "Listen to this man's story and look at him, and tell me if, in all your enormous experience, you ever saw a case like this."

Osteoarthritis of The Hip

Occasionally, one sees a middle-aged or elderly man walking with a limp and perhaps using a cane. He may be a bit overweight, and he complains of pain and stiffness in

one or both hip joints. At first he notices it more at the end of the day, especially if he has walked much. It is relieved by rest. Sometimes the ache becomes so bad that it interferes with sleep. It is aggravated by damp weather and cold. Often a laboring man, with a hip, has to quit work. An x-ray film of the bad joint will show that it is so gnarled and deformed by bony disease that one cannot hope to cure the man with any medical treatment. I used to say that these unhappy people could be cured only by getting a new joint from the factory!

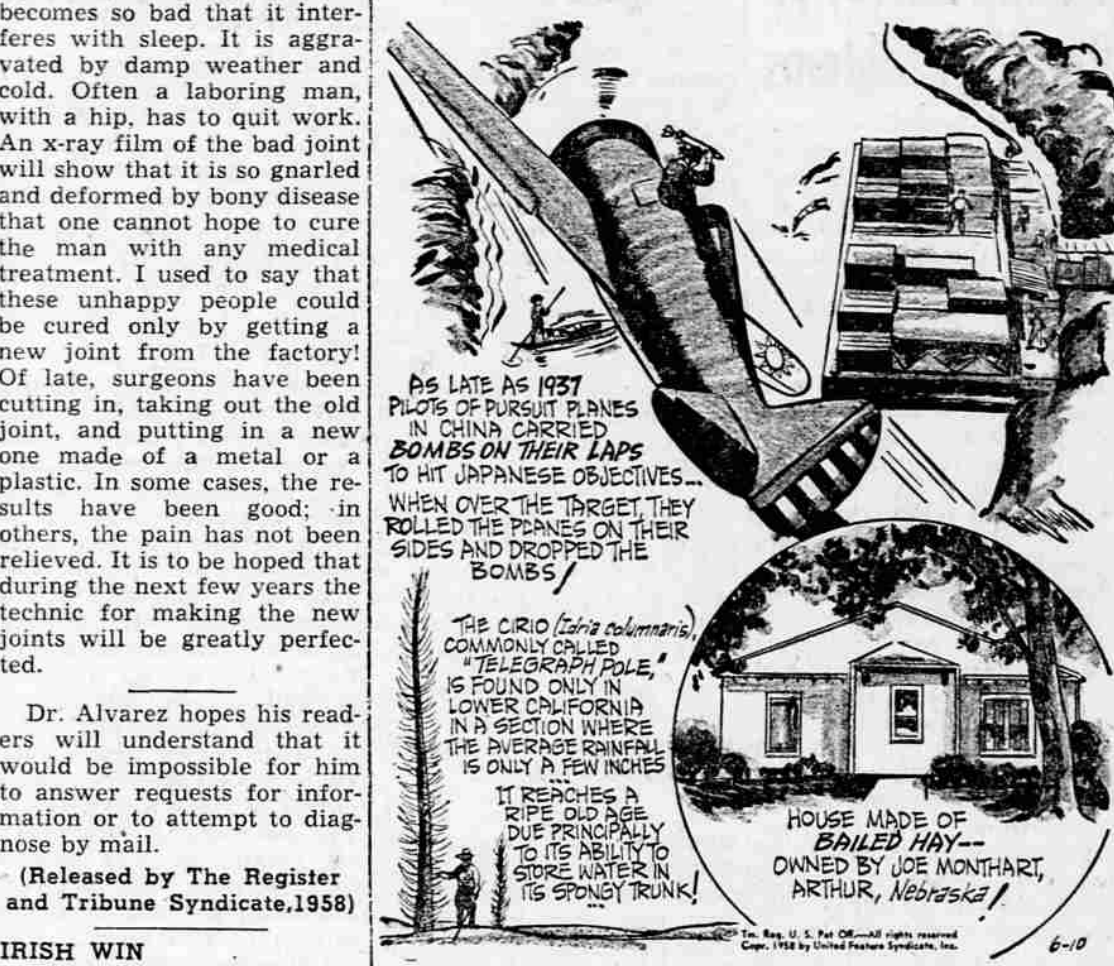
Of late, surgeons have been cutting in, taking out the old joint, and putting in a new one made of a metal or a plastic. In some cases, the results have been good; in others, the pain has not been relieved. It is to be hoped that during the next few years the technique for making the new joints will be greatly perfected.
