Shooters were beginning to arrive today for the annual Oregon State shoot of the Pacific International Trapshooting association at Medford Gun Club.

Some practice activity was anticipated today at the 10-trap layout on West Villas rd., but registered gunning won't start until Thursday at 10:30 a.m. Thursday shooting is just warm-up, however. Competition for state titles begins at 9 a.m. Friday with 200-target 10-yard class championships.

Shoot continues through Sunday, June 15, winding up with the Oregon State Handicap. Medford Gun Club is just west of the Crater Lake highway Four Corners.

Among those to arrive today were Oregon State Trapshooting association and PITA officials and others who will assist with the shoot. W. W. Higgins, Cottage Grove, state president, was on hand this morning. State Secretary George Blum, Tillamook, was slated to arrive around noon and Gordon Hull, Salem, and PITA secretary, is due this evening. Others arriving today included Harry Helzer, Portland, and Marshall Wells.

The club's dining facilities will be in operation with breakfasts and lunches scheduled to be served during the tourney.

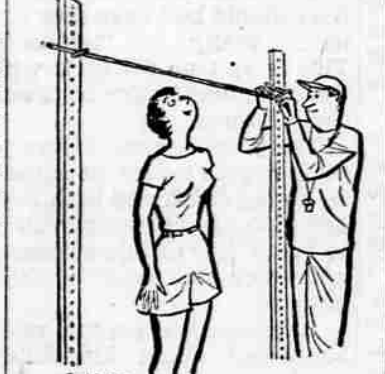

Scranton, Pa. — (UPI) — The pro boxing debut of Olympic wrestling champion Dan Hodge, which resulted in a first-round knockout victory Tuesday night, was clouded today by a boxing commission decision to investigate his opponent.

Hodge, who won the Olympic light heavyweight wrestling crown in 1956 and then became the Golden Gloves heavyweight boxing champion, knocked out Norm Jackson of Youngstown, Ohio, at 1:12 of the first round of their scheduled eight-round feature bout.

But Boxing Commissioner Jim Crowley, one of Notre Dame's famed "Four Horsemen" of football, announced after the bout he was "dissatisfied" with Jackson's showing and was holding up his purse of \$200 pending an investigation.

Seattle — (UPI) — An aerial search was resumed today for a single-engine Navion plane missing on a flight from Spokane to Portland since Monday night with at least one man, and possibly two, aboard.

The Washington State Aeronautics Commission said seven planes were searching in the Spokane area and others had left Walla Walla to take part in the search.

Tuesday, 31 planes combed the most logical route the plane could have followed, without success.

Phil Tappe, 45, Bremerton, father of two sons, aged 11 and 7, was the pilot of the missing plane. A second man, identified as Harlan Teer, Bremerton, also as believed to have been aboard the aircraft.

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Students' Luck Tip-Off on Jobs

Washington — (UPI) — Students' luck in finding jobs across the country this week will be the tip-off on how much of a June boom in unemployment will be recorded this year.

The government count of the nation's jobless for this month will start next week when interviewers begin making the rounds of 35,000 sample households.

An outpouring of youngsters from the schools and colleges is expected to boost the unemployment total, but many government economists doubt seriously that it will reach six million as Labor Secretary James P. Mitchell indicated.

Won't Count Loafers There is little doubt, however, that unemployment will again soar past the five million mark. It dipped to 4,904,000 in May.

The federal fact-finders will not count as unemployed those youngsters who are loafing this summer and not actively looking for work. Children under 14 are not counted at all.

Unemployment usually goes up by 15 per cent from May to June because of the rush for jobs by teen-agers. Economists doubt that it will rise that much this year considering the high level of unemployment now. If it did, unemployment would reach 5,650,000, a postwar record.

Tough Guy Bill Norman Takes Over Tiger Managerial Post

Boston — (UPI) — Bill Norman, a "tough guy" today began mapping plans to accomplish what "nice guy" Jack Tighe failed to do — make the Detroit Tigers a winning team.

Norman, who once managed the old St. Louis Browns for "four or five" days, took over as Detroit manager on Tuesday when Tighe was fired.

Tiger General Manager John McHale, who made the decision to fire Tighe and promote Norman from the Charleston farm club in the American association, spelled it out:

"Norman is the kind of a manager we need. He has the iron fist and velvet glove that is needed. He is a hard rock." "I don't know what makes a nice guy or a tough guy," the tall, rugged Norman said. "I'm just me."

No Einstein "I'm no Einstein," he said. "I don't think anyone is reprimanded unless he deserves it. I will not hesitate to reprimand."

Tighe tried reprimanding. But it was too late. The Tigers stumbled badly in spring training. The American league team slumped badly as the season progressed. Tighe was fired 12 hours after the squad fell in the cellar in a defeat here by the Boston Red Sox. Tighe's last official act as manager was a two-minute "dutch
