Portland —(UPI)—Lovely Ruth Parrett of Grant High school, daughter of a Methodist minister, was selected queen of the 1958 Portland Rose Festival Wednesday night.

A crowd of 21,983 in Multnomah stadium attended coronation ceremonies honoring the 1958 queen of Rosaria and her court of 10 princesses.

Miss Parrett is the second girl from Grant in the past three years to be named queen. Sharon Frey of Grant was the 1956 queen.

She is the daughter of the Rev. and Mrs. O. E. Parrett.

Two Buried in Ditch Cave-in

Vancouver, Wash.—(UPI)—Two men were buried for a time in an excavation here Wednesday afternoon when a bank of dirt fell over them as they worked on a retaining wall at the fringe of the city.

Norman D. Havlich, 24, Vancouver, was buried for about 10 minutes. Vancouver firemen said. Cilas M. Barnes, about 36, Vancouver, was buried to above the knees and could not move, firemen said.

Firemen reported that Havlich stopped breathing and was revived by a fire department resuscitator. He was reported in "very good" condition on Permanent hospital here.

Barnes told sheriff's deputies and firemen that he was unable to help his companion when the bank of dirt fell over them. He said he finally attracted the attention of a resident in the area who called sheriff's deputies and the fire department.

Graham Speaks On Temptations

San Francisco —(UPI)—Evangelist Billy Graham says every human being is alone in the battle against Satan unless Christ is with him.

Graham spoke on the temptations of the Devil Wednesday night in his sermon to 14,800 at the Cow Palace. He is in the final week of his seven-week crusade.

Graham emphasized that being tempted is not a sin but that the sin comes in yielding to the temptation.

"Man is never tempted beyond his capacity to withstand temptation," Graham said. "The Devil is most interested in tempting those closest to God. Some people he doesn't even bother about."

He warned that Satan attacks in three ways—through "the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eye and pride."

The secret of resisting temptation, he said, is to be obedient to God, to be filled with the Holy Spirit, to spend time in prayer and to know the scriptures.

Packing School Slated in July

The annual Medford vocational gear packing school will be held July 10-25, according to Charles King, Nye and Naumes Packing company, chairman of the school.

Hours of the course will be 9 to noon and 1 to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday.

King reported that students sponsored by the packing houses in the area would be given first consideration in the registration. Others will be registered if vacancies occur. There is a \$3 registration fee for the course.

The packing school is sponsored by the Fruit Growers League of Jackson county, the Medford Pear Shippers association and the state department of vocational education. It will be conducted this year at Southern Oregon Sales packing plant.

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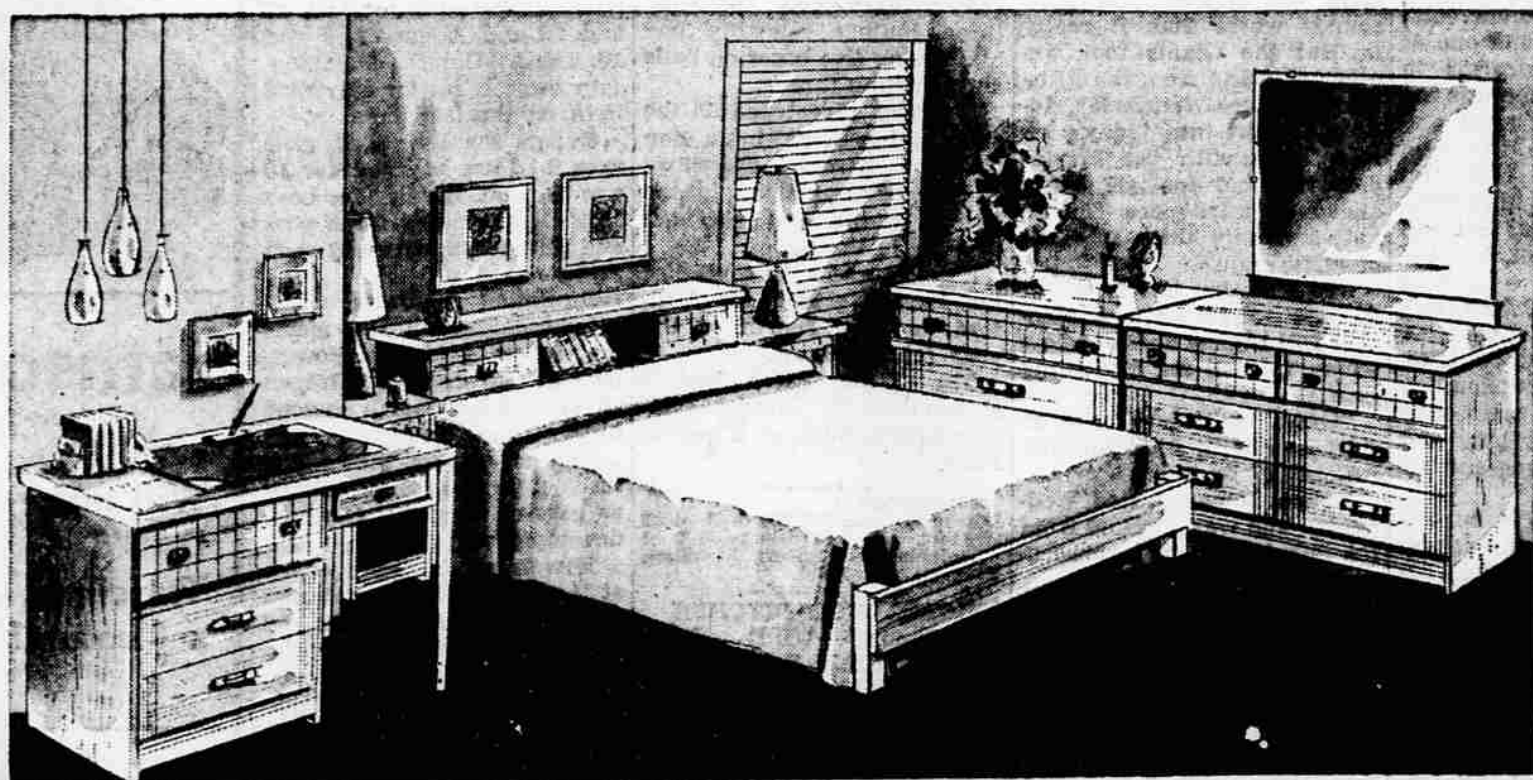
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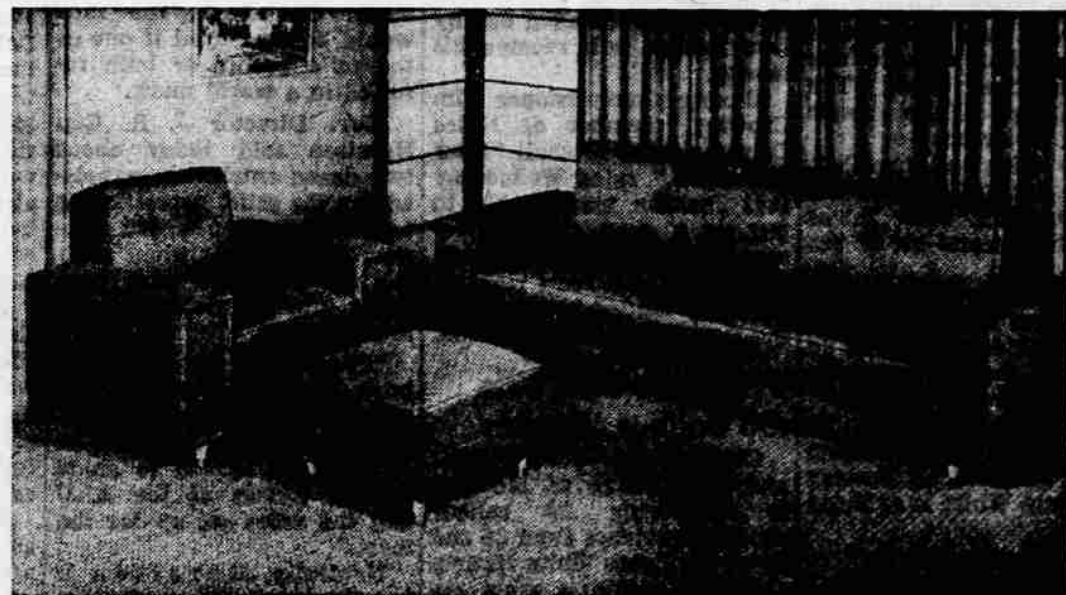
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
