Former Halfway Bank Cashier Pleads Guilty

Portland—(UPI)—Clair Ritter, 52, former cashier of the First National Bank of Halfway, Ore., Wednesday pleaded guilty to embezzling some \$99,000 from the institution.

U.S. District Judge William East delayed sentencing pending a probation office investigation.

Los Angeles—(UPI)—A pet shop owner who got more than he bargained for in a purchase decided to stop payment on a check, according to the Security-First National bank.

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Knight's Debt Said Paid With Laborers

Washington—(UPI)—A labor union official charged Wednesday that Gov. Goodwin J. Knight of California recently paid off a political debt to a campaign contributor by ordering 500 Mexicans assigned to work on his farm.

The official charged that Knight overruled a local employment service manager who had insisted that the California grower was not entitled to the Mexican laborers.

The employment service official held that unemployed Americans were available for work and were entitled to preference under the law.

The accusation was made against Knight in testimony prepared for a House agriculture subcommittee by H. J. Mitchell, spokesman for the National Agricultural Workers Union.

Is That So? The Medical Roundup

Thebes—Karnak's ruined temple of Ammon is an awesome place, particularly by moonlight.

After half an hour among the sculptured 80-foot columns, I had the uneasy feeling we were being watched.

We left the temple, and as I paused to light a cigarette in the avenue of sphinxes guarding its approach, I saw that we were being watched—by an owl.

He was one of the little ones common throughout Egypt and often seen by day.

He was sitting on a sphinx. Full grown, not over nine inches long at the outside, his yellow eyes looked enormous in his face that seemed to make up nearly a third of him.

It was only a few seconds that he sat there before taking off on his easy, noiseless flight. Nonetheless, there seemed to be such acute intelligence in his look that I fully understood why both the ancient Greeks and Egyptians used him as a symbol of wisdom.

Later, on the way back to the hotel, we saw and heard another owl that was very like our common screech owl. He is half again as big as the little one. Instead of a predominantly plain, grayish-brown coloration, he has a white face and white underparts that make him readily distinguishable aside from the size.

We were warned of this one's approach by the piercing scream that he had made a few seconds before he came in sight. He appeared almost like a swiftly drifting blob of snow, quartering across the sky some 30 or 40 feet above us. When he was almost out of sight, he plummeted earthward, doubtless to investigate some rodent.

Tremendous Appetite Like the little owl, he, too, is seen throughout the country and especially in the neighborhood of man. The reason is that he has a tremendous appetite, and the only place in which he can begin to satisfy it is in or near the cultivated areas where rats, lizards, birds and even fish which he occasionally supplements his diet.

An indication of his capacity and the value he represents to Egypt is to be found in the report of one naturalist who observed a screech owl eat nine mice in succession, the last one being so crowded for room that its tail was still hanging out of the owl's beak as the bird settled down to digest the meal.
