Ex-Disc Jockey Charged with Gas Station Robbery

Seattle—(UPI)—Former disc jockey Jack E. Simpson, who disappeared while playing a game of hide-and-go-seek with his bride of one week, was charged Friday with armed robbery after a gasoline station attendant identified Simpson by a wedding picture.

Simpson, who came here with his bride after their wedding in Yakima, is still at large, although an all-points bulletin for his arrest was issued Wednesday.

The bride, who at first said she was 20 and later was found to be only 17, also is missing. She was wanted by Walla Walla authorities on a runaway charge.

Report Disappearance
After reporting her husband had disappeared when the couple began playing hide-and-go-seek in a vacant lot in the Capitol Hill district here early Tuesday, she herself disappeared. She had said she was going to drive her husband's car back to Yakima where the couple had an apartment.

Meantime, police investigating the robbery of a service station near the vacant lot obtained a wedding photograph of the couple, and the attendant, Fendrex N. Cunningham, identified Simpson as the man who had robbed him, and said the girl had been in the station several times before the robbery occurred.

One of the employer representatives, Harry Heuer of Portland, said he and the others planned to submit their resignations "in several weeks" to Gov. Robert D. Holms. Other employer representatives are Bob Roberg, Condon, and William Oetinger and Al Teller, both of Portland.

Representatives On Council May Resign Positions

Portland—(UPI)—All four employer representatives on the Oregon State Apprenticeship council are threatening to resign because of union domination of labor in the council.

The council is the administrative body for all apprenticeship program in Oregon.

After the employer announcement, the labor apprenticeship advisory council here voted to ask Gov. Holmes to refuse the resignations of Oetinger and Heuer. The labor group also decided to ask the governor for the resignation of State Apprenticeship Director A. C. Hoggan. The requests were forwarded to the governor Friday, according to J. T. Marr, executive secretary of the AFL-CIO Oregon State Labor Council.

Marr said labor considers Hoggan an "unqualified" but wants Oetinger and Heuer to remain on the council because "they are valuable members and we need experienced people."

BLM Timber Sold At Recent Auction

Bids totaling \$697,716.05 were placed for 26,246,000 board feet of timber offered by the bureau of land management at its regular auction June 12, according to Medford District Manager Ross Youngblood.

Competition prevailed for each of the five tracts of timber offered, with 107 bids recorded for the largest one. It was estimated to consist of 12,279,000 board feet predominantly Douglas fir and white fir. Purchased was Kogap Manufacturing company, Medford, at a total price of \$327,557.45.

Kogap also purchased another tract of timber in Jackson county containing 3,698,000 board feet. The sale price was \$102,082.10, with \$36.40 per thousand board feet bid for the Douglas fir.

A third tract in Jackson county went to Olson-Ross Lumber company, Medford, for \$143,647.10.

High bidder on a tract of 2,906,000 board feet in Josephine county was Getson Mills Inc., Grants Pass, with a total offer of \$72,509.55.

Sunny Valley Lumber company, Grants Pass, placed the

high bid of \$51,919.85 for an estimated 1,794,000 board feet of BLM timber in Douglas county. More than 60 persons attended the timber auction.
