Mosquito Spraying Done in Valley
A mosquito spraying crew from the Jackson county health department was covering all ponds and roadside ditches on county property in the Sams Valley area yesterday, according to Orle Moore, county sanitarian.
Since spray crews are not allowed to spray on private property, Moore suggested residents spray around homes with a solution of 25 per cent DDT in a water mixture.
A spray with an oil base will possibly damage the more tender plants around the home, he explained. He suggested a fairly strong solution be used around and underneath the house. This should be spread around the shrubbery next to the house, around the foundations, under the house and up under the eaves, the sanitarian suggested.
Moore added that although the county area has some anopheles mosquitoes, malaria carriers, they are not a problem here. The nights are too cold, he said.
Health department spray crews are attempting to get the adult mosquitoes before they lay eggs and in this way head off the spring hatch, he added. So far this has proved satisfactory, he added.

Van Nuys, Calif.—(UPI)—Lockheed's new "Bird," a faster version of the X7 missile, was ready for the Air Force today a month ahead of schedule. The 37-foot, air-breathing missile will be tested from a B50 bomb bay at the Air Force's Missile Development Center at Alamogordo, N.M. Lockheed said the missile is equipped with a parachute and a nose spike, enabling it to be recovered and flown again. Each recovery would save \$350,000.
