### Boeing To Test New Jet Transport

Boston—(UPI)—The Boeing Aircraft company will attempt a transcontinental record June 26 between Boston and Seattle with its newest jet transport, the "Boston Globe" reported today.

The newspaper said it was presumed the firm selected Boston as the destination because the runways at Logan International Airport are among the few in the nation which can accommodate the giant craft.

The plane, called the Boeing 707, was described as "Pan American Airlines' third jet transport."

It also will be flown Saturday from Seattle to Oklahoma City for the dedication of the Civil Aeronautics Administration Flight Technical Center there, the newspaper said.

It will then go to Baltimore, Philadelphia and return to Seattle to prepare for the record attempt.

### Youth Suggested For West Point

Airman Duane Sides, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. R. Sides, 926 Murray st., Medford, has been recommended for West Point by his commanding officer, according to his father.

Sides wrote his father that recently he appeared before a board of ranking officers at Godwin Air Force base, Ft. Knox, Ky., and was told he would be recommended for an appointment to West Point. Sides is now a corporal and second in command of the control tower at the airfield.

Sides entered the Air Force in September, 1957. He took basic training at Ft. Ord, Calif., then went to the Air Force school on air traffic control at Keesler Air Force base, Mississippi. He graduated second in his class in April. From there he was sent to Goodwin Air Force base.

Sides is expected home early in July on a 21-day leave. Prior to the service the airman graduated from Medford High school and spent two years at Southern Oregon college, Ashland. He was a pitcher on the college varsity baseball team and played for the Cheney Studs in the Rogue Valley league.

### Nursemaid Held For Kidnaping Of Canadian Boy

Toronto—(UPI)—Three Montreal detectives were scheduled to fly here today to serve a warrant on Mrs. Margareta Goede, 46, charging her with the kidnaping of Joel Reitman, 2½-year-old heir to a clothing chain store fortune. The blonde, neatly dressed suspect emigrated to Canada from Germany in 1954.

Detectives said Mrs. Goede, who worked as a waitress, maid and housekeeper in various parts of Western Canada, arrived in Montreal June 2 and was given two names the following day from the Unemployment Insurance Commission as possible employers.

### Hired For Job

One of the names was Cyril Reitman and police said she was hired there immediately when she applied for a job.

Mrs. Reitman, whose father-in-law heads a chain of ladies wear clothing stores, described Mrs. Goede as a tremendous maid and as fond of her son, Joel, as he was of her.

However, last Saturday while the Reitmans were attending a dance, Joel and the maid disappeared.

He was found in Ottawa where taxi driver Edward Royer said a woman passenger had asked him to find a baby sitter for the boy while she shopped.

Mrs. Goede maintained Wednesday she had been impersonated in Montreal and denied she was the woman employed by the Reitmans.

### Liberty Freighter Taken in Custody

Portland—(UPI)—The U.S. Marshal here Wednesday took the Liberty freighter Harold D. Whitehead into custody at a Portland terminal after members of the crew filed a labor action in Federal court for \$68,000 in back wages.

Capt. Philip Curran, master of the Whitehead, had told the crew there was no money for wages. An attorney for the crew asked the court to condemn and sell the ship to satisfy the wage claims of the 36 crewmen.

The Whitehead sailed from Galveston, Texas, last December, moving between foreign ports until it arrived in Portland last week in ballast.

Owner of the vessel is Whitehead Steamship Company of New York.

Toronto—Greta Goede, 46, German immigrant maid arrested here Wednesday as the suspected ransom-kidnaper of little Joel Reitman from his suburban Montreal home, claiming she is the victim of mistaken identity:

"Maybe somebody is using my name. Somebody I may have met sometime. I want my name cleared."

New York—Ralph Casey, chief negotiator representing 43 Atlantic and Gulf Coast shipping companies, after revealing that bargaining talks had been broken off with the striking Marine Engineers Beneficial Association:

"I told them we're all through talking."

Inglewood, Calif.—Albert Clark Reed, 51, a groom at Hollywood Park race track, who was unmasked Wednesday as a top-flight aeronautical engineer who vanished mysteriously six years ago after working at top secret jobs for the government at California Institute of Technology:

"I don't know why I suddenly left my wife and child. I don't know what I will do now, but I love this work and hope to stay with horses."

### Highway Group Ends Inspection

Portland—(UPI)—The Oregon Highway commission today concluded its 1047-mile inspection trip of Oregon highways and returned here for a scheduled meeting to award \$13 million worth of highway construction contracts.

The commission arrived in Bend Wednesday and conducted an evening meeting at the Bend Golf club. Commission Chairman Milo McIver of

Portland told the Bend group that bids would be called in July for a Highway 97 widening project at the south entrance to Bend. He said another project to relocate the Salem-Sublimis Gun club section of the North Santiam highway between Salem and Bend would make it "perhaps the finest trans-Cascade route in Oregon."
