**Radioactivity in Humans Increased**

Waynesville, N. C.—(UPI)—A top Army medical researcher said Thursday that radioactive elements in the bodies of human beings have increased "roughly 100 per cent" in the last two years but he does not believe the increase is harmful.

"The levels of fallout collected in man are well below tolerance," Col. James B. Hartgering told a meeting of doctors from seven states.

Hartgering, director of the Division of Nuclear Medicine and Chemistry of the Research Institute at the Army's Walter Reed Hospital in Washington, spoke at the fifth annual Mountaintop Medical Assembly.

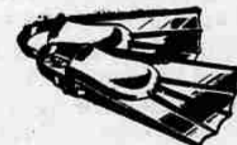

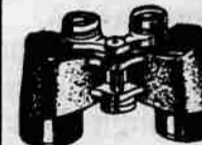
