America Declared in Danger Of Losing Sight of Individual

New York — (UPI) — A Rockefeller Brothers Fund report said Monday the "source of a nation's greatness" is the individual and warned that America is in danger of losing sight of that fact.

The report, one of a series aimed at assessing the major problems and opportunities of the U.S. in the next 10 to 15 years, said the bulk of present day social achievement is gained by group effort.

"It is our ability to marshal and unite the skills and abilities of thousands of individuals that makes possible the achievements of modern technology . . . The danger is that we may forget the individual behind a facade of huge and impersonal institutions."

Sputnik III To Be Visible Over Oregon

Boston, Mass.—(UPI)—Russia's space traveler, Sputnik III, will be visible over Portland for about one minute at 6:16 a.m. Wednesday, the Smithsonian Institute reported Monday.

The satellite will be moving in a northeasterly direction low in the northern sky.

The Institute said the satellite will be seen again in the Portland area next Saturday about 5:27 a.m. moving northeasterly. After that Sputnik will not be visible anywhere in the U.S. for several weeks.

Alaska Statehood Bill Expected Before Week End

Washington—(UPI)—Assistant Senate Democratic leader Mike Mansfield (Mont.) said Monday he expects the bill to make Alaska the 49th state will be sent to the White House before this week is over.

The House already has approved the measure. Mansfield said he believed the Senate would pass it without change, and it would go directly to President Eisenhower for his signature.

Warns Against Tie-in

The Montana emphasized that if the legislation should be amended it might touch off another fight in the House. He particularly warned against any efforts to tie the Alaska bill to a similar Hawaii statehood proposal.

Before taking up statehood, the Senate plans to act on a House-passed bill providing for exchange of U.S. atomic information with NATO allies.

The House meantime is set to vote Tuesday on a compromise foreign aid bill.

Would Grant Immunity

Rep. Kenneth B. Keating (R-N.Y.) said he would introduce a bill today to grant "small-time" crooks immunity from prosecution if they testify at trials or grand jury proceedings against "big-time racketeers."

Keating, top-ranking GOP member of the House Judiciary Committee, said the measure would help federal grand juries "put the finger" on the 100 top racketeers—now targets of a Justice Department crackdown.

Contamination of River Averted

Grand Junction, Colo.—(UPI)—A crane has retrieved a truck and its radioactive capsule which could have contaminated the Colorado river down to the California border.

The truck, which belonged to the Wellex Corp., plunged into the Colorado near Palisade Friday night. Atomic Energy Commission officials said the lead-encased radium and beryllium it was carrying would have given the river a contaminating dose of radioactivity had it leaked through.

Both the truck and the capsule were pulled from the river after skin-divers located them in about 25 feet of water.

The truck driver, Robert L. Truitt, 21, Grand Junction, was returning from a day's work in the Piceance Creek gas fields 90 miles from where his 17-ton, 10-wheel truck swayed toward the shoulder and splashed into the river. Truitt swam to safety.

The capsule was used in testing rock and soil formations around oil wells.

Judge Rejects Bid To Stay Order

Little Rock, Ark.—(UPI)—U.S. District Judge Harry J. Lemley has rejected a request by National Association for the Advancement of Colored People to stay his order suspending integration until 1961 at Central High school here.

The judge issued his decision after a recess of almost an hour, following arguments for the delay. Wiley Branton, a Negro attorney from Pine Bluff, Ark., urged the judge to stay his order because of the time it would take to appeal the judge's decision.

Cheryl Repeats Stabbing Story

Hollywood—(UPI)—A nervous Cheryl Crane, 14, daughter of actress Lana Turner, Monday retold the story of how she fatally stabbed Johnny Stompanato last April 4 because she thought he planned to harm her mother.

Cheryl, accompanied by Miss Turner, testified at a deposition hearing in a \$705,000 damage action brought against the actress, the daughter and Cheryl's father, restaurateur Stephen Crane, on behalf of Stompanato's son, John III, 10, Hammond, Ind.

The hearing was closed to newsmen and Attorney William Pollack, representing Stompanato's son, said he expected to spend most of the day questioning Cheryl. Miss Turner is scheduled to give her deposition Wednesday.
