Jet Tankers To Soak Speed Record

Washington—(UPI)—Four of the Air Force's new KC132 jet tankers take off early Friday in attempts to set New York-London speed records.

Two of the big tankers will attempt to fly non-stop to London and return. The other two will try to better existing records from New York to London, and from London to New York, landing in Britain before their return.

The present record for the round trip is 14 hours and 21 minutes. It was set by Royal Air Force Capt. J. W. Hackett in a British Canberra bomber Aug. 23, 1955.

James Roosevelt Urges U. S. Stand

Columbus, Ohio—(UPI)—U.S. Rep. James Roosevelt (D-Calif.) said he believes the United States should take a strong stand against Communist aggression in Lebanon.

Appearing at a tenth anniversary celebration of the State of Israel, Roosevelt said if the U. S. had supported Israel in the Suez Canal crisis "Israel would have finished the job and I don't believe we would have had the trouble with a man called Nasser today."

The Medical Roundup

Our Cruel Treatment of Unfortunate Men

I have received from Weidenfeld and Nicolson, of 7 Cork Street, London, W.1, a remarkable book which I wish all thoughtful and kindly Americans, and especially all legislators would read. It is called

"Against the Law," and was written by a young journalist who obviously is a fine idealistic man.

His first great misfortune is that he was born an unhappy homosexual, lonely, and craving love, a home and children, but too honorable to marry a woman whom he could never love adequately in a physical way. He early decided to live decently, and never to have anything to do with boys. Unfortunately, he got caught in a dragnet set by the police to catch a certain homosexual Lord. With-out any warrant or excuse, the police searched Wilde-blood's apartment, and the apartments of his closest friends; they appropriated all his letters; read them, and later used some of them in court to damn him. They railroaded him into jail on the very questionable evidence given by a stool pigeon who had to testify against him, or else.

Why Women With Cancer Are Treated With Male Hormone

Women who have had a cancer of the breast or the ovary or uterus wonder why they are being given large doses of male hormone. They are being treated in this way because it was observed many years ago that if a woman with recurrent cancer of the breast or uterus had her ovaries removed, she was likely to get much better for a while. Apparently, the female hormone kept helping the sexual cells in the cancer to grow, and when this hormone was removed, the cells for a while grew slowly. Similarly, it was found that when an elderly man gets a scattered cancer of his prostate gland, the growth of the tumor cells is likely to be slowed if he is castrated. Then it was found that similar slowing-up effects could be produced by giving the woman an with breast or womb or ovarian cancer male hormone.

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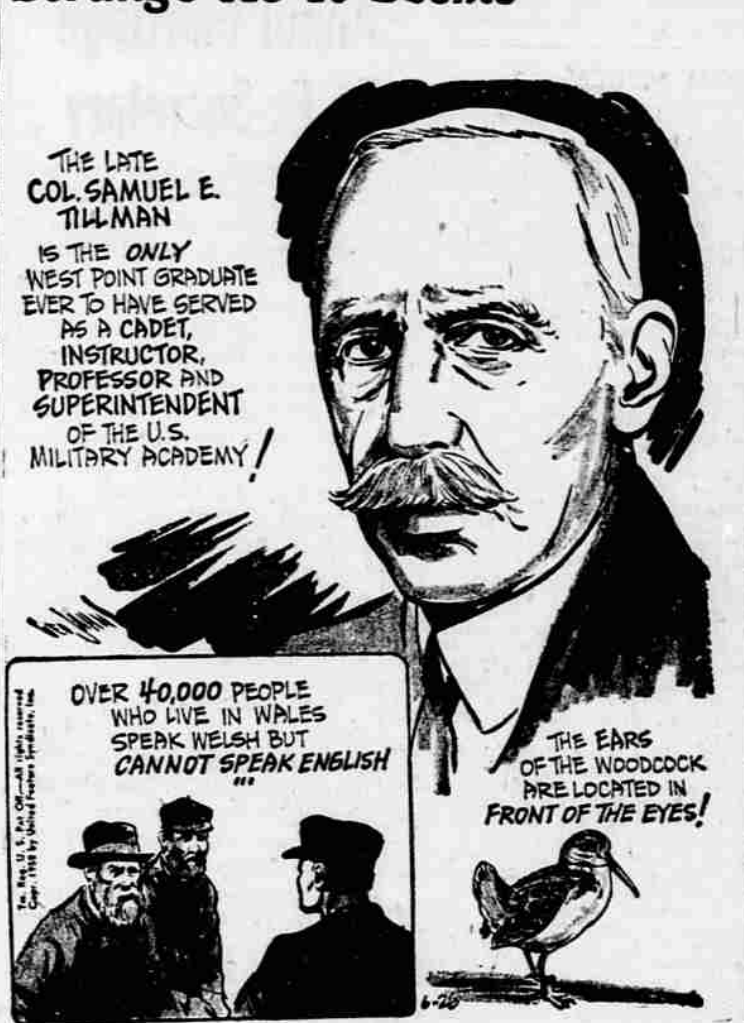
