

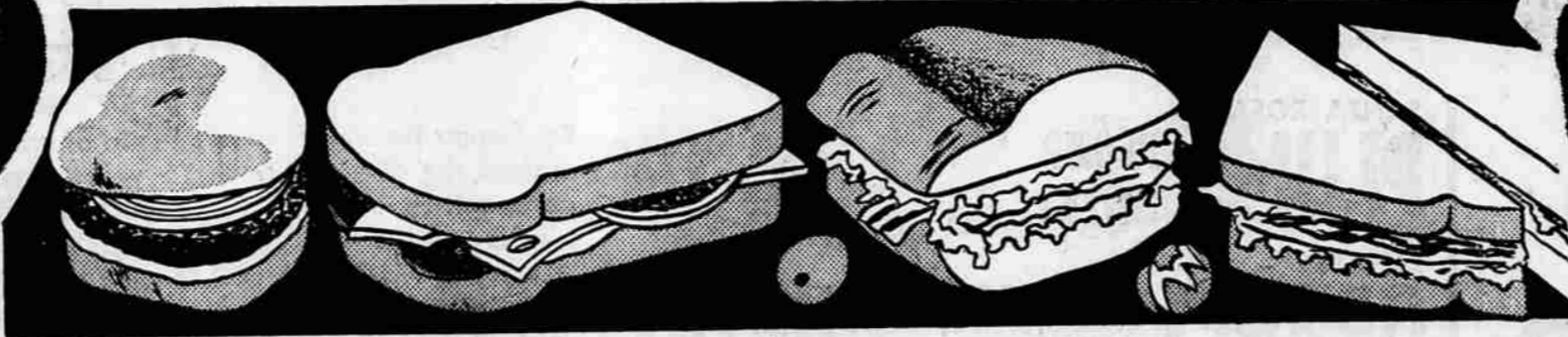

Resignation of Adams Favored By Sen. Knowland

Washington—(UPI)—Senate Republican Leader William F. Knowland said today that Presidential Aide Sherman Adams could "best serve" President Eisenhower and the Republican party by resigning.

Knowland added, however, that he did not believe the Adams case would "materially" hurt him in his campaign for governor of California.

"They're not going to hold me personally responsible for Adams' decision or the President's decision," the California Republican said.

Usefulness Damaged
Knowland previously had made clear that he felt Adams' usefulness had been badly damaged by House committee disclosures that the presidential assistant received gifts from Bernard Goldfine, a Boston businessman in trouble with government agencies.

At a news conference today, his 50th birthday, Knowland said, "I believe he (Adams) could best serve the cause of the President and the party by submitting his resignation."

Knowland also said he expects to confer at Sacramento Friday with Gov. Goodwin J. Knight, Republican nominee for Knowland's Senate seat in the election next November.

To Run Own Campaign
Knight, who dissents from Knowland's endorsement of a state right to work law, has indicated that he intends to run his own independent campaign.

"I've made my position clear," Knowland said. "I'm certainly going to do everything possible to bring about unity in the party."

He said it was too early to predict what the state GOP convention would include in the party platform on the right to work issue. Californians will vote in November on a proposal for a state law outlawing union contracts requiring union membership to hold a job.

Air Crash Victim In Good Condition

John Day—(UPI)—Mrs. Patricia Davis of Fresno, Calif., who is still hospitalized here as a result of plane crash injuries suffered April 21, was reported in good condition today following more surgery earlier this week.

Mrs. Davis, whose courage in the face of repeated operations has attracted wide admiration, suffered badly frozen feet when a small plane piloted by her husband crashed in the mountains near Dayville, Ore. She lay at the wreckage several days before she was rescued.

Mrs. Davis is now in a body cast while skin from her left leg is grafted to her right foot. The left foot was amputated earlier, as well as the toes of the right foot. Mrs. Davis will require still further amputation on her left leg so she can be fitted with an artificial limb, according to Dr. Jerry van der Vlugt at the medical center here.

The physician reported his patient is in good spirits and progressing well. Her husband leader Bruce Davis, visits her frequently but is now back at his job in California.

Exercise Said Fountain of Youth

San Francisco—(UPI)—A Kentucky doctor has done what Ponce de Leon failed to do. He's found the fountain of youth.

It's an eight-letter word called E-X-E-R-C-I-S-E.

Dr. Ernst Jokl told the American Medical Association today that this nobly ignored word, when followed to the letter, stays the arrival of degenerative ailments.

But, he said, it must be followed consistently and not on a fad basis.

The aging processes reversed, according to the Lexington physiologist, are chiefly those having to do with the "mainstream of life—the heart and blood vessel systems."

Jokl, reporting to AMA convention, stressed the fact that exercise is "the only environmental factor yet known to inhibit the aging process."

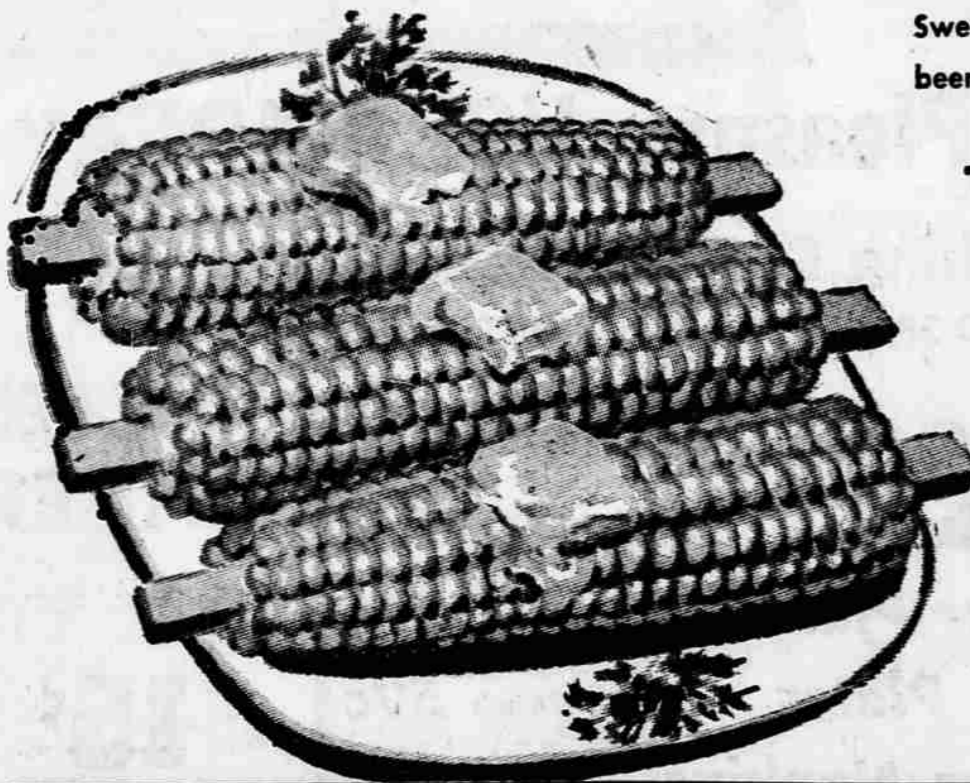
