

Drivers Licenses Of 402 Suspended By State Orders

The name of James Edward Durkee, 42, of Sterling Creek rd., was incorrectly listed as being among those found guilty of driving while intoxicated in a recent printing of the list from the state department of motor vehicles.

Durkee was tried in Jackson county district court May 28, and was found innocent.

His name was included on the next list of the motor vehicle department, incorrectly, and the Mail Tribune printed it in good faith. It regrets any embarrassment caused Mr. Durkee.

The error is being called to the attention of the department of motor vehicles.

Salem—The department of motor vehicles has released names of 402 drivers whose licenses were ordered suspended during the period beginning June 16 and ending June 20.

Length of suspension varies, depending on charges involved, recommendation of court, discretionary action by the department or requirements of Oregon law. The department said some of the licenses involving financial responsibility and court recommendations may have been re-instated after suspension was ordered.

The department warned drivers that the penalty for driving while suspended is a jail sentence of no less than two days and up to six months, and there may be imposed a fine up to \$500. Under licensing procedures, this will also result in an additional year of suspension.

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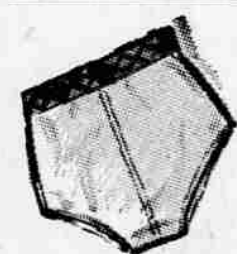
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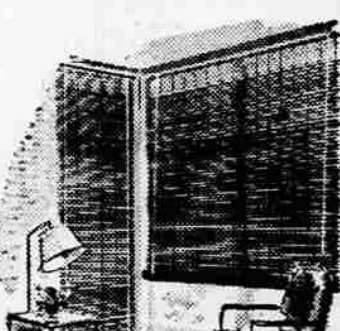
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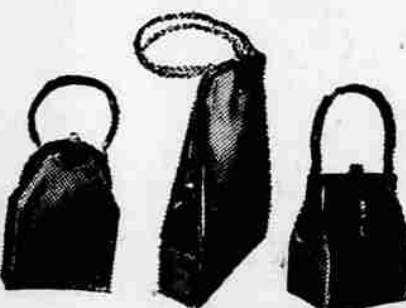
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
