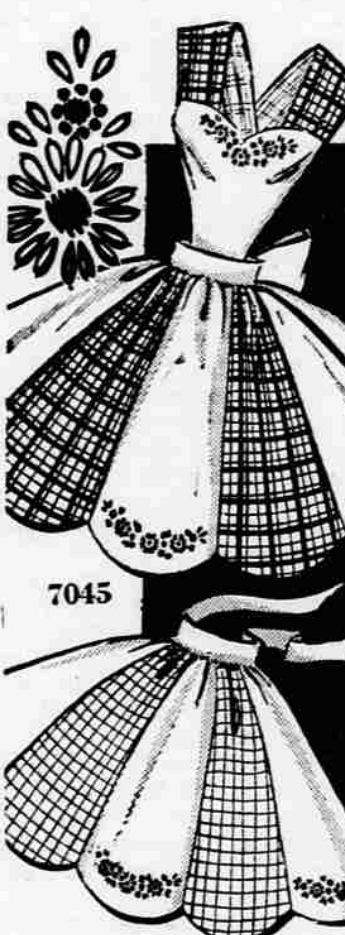
284 Register Since
Primary Election

A total of 284 Jackson county residents have registered to vote since the May 16 state primary, according to elections department officials today.

Totals include 17,341 Republicans; 16,071 Democrats; and 728 miscellaneous. As of today there are 34,140 registered voters in the county.

May 16 totals showed 17,185 Republicans; 15,942 Democrats; and 729 miscellaneous with a total of 33,856 registered.

George Layman To Seek Speaker Post

Newberg — (UPI) — State Rep. George Layman, Newberg Republican, has stated that he would be a candidate for speaker of the Oregon House of Representatives in 1959, provided he is reelected in November and the Republicans regain control of the lower House.
