Capital Punishment Discussed by Synod COUNTY CHURCHES

Portland — (UPI) — The Presbyterian Synod of Oregon adopted a compromise resolution Thursday in which it opposed the current system of capital punishment.

The Synod, closing its 68th annual meeting here, urged that the subject of capital punishment be studied carefully by individuals "in light of their Christian faith" before the fall election when voters will decide on the issue.

Oregon's congressional delegation was praised in another resolution for efforts to protect rights of Klamath Indians in sale of their property.
