The Medical Roundup

Two able and thoughtful psychiatrists are Drs. Hervey M. Cleckley and Corbett H. Thigpen of Augusta, Ga. A while ago, in their article, "The Dynamics of Illusion," read before the American Psychiatric Association, they said, "Apparently

ing which, for a moment, they may stop talking, their eyes may flutter, and their eyes may turn up. During this time, they usually will not answer questions. An electroencephalogram generally shows a typical large wave pattern.

Other children will suddenly lose tone in their muscles so that they will slump to the floor or almost fall. Immediately, they will get up. Little babies, less than two years old, may suddenly raise their hands while their head falls forward. Other children for some seconds, will perform peculiar movements, or will behave peculiarly, with apparently a loss of consciousness. If asked, anxiously by the mother, "What is the matter? what are you doing?" the child will not answer. The wise mother will take such a child to some place where a series of electroencephalograms (records of the tiny electrical currents constantly forming in the brain) can be made. In eight of 10 cases, these records will show definitely what is wrong. Then treatment can be started.

Influences of Heredity

A woman writes that every time she has to nurse an infant, she gets into trouble because she has two extra breasts near the front of her chest. Milk runs out of them and into her clothes, which causes her great embarrassment. I am sure a surgeon could easily remove them for her. Interestingly, she says, "My mother and my sister each have them."

Through the years I have seen a few men with as many as five nipples, which, of course, represents a throwback to our very early mammalian ancestors who lived several million years ago. The other day I saw a woman with two "branchial" cysts on the side of her neck—relics of the gills of fishes—throwback to some hundreds of millions of years ago. Our bodies contain a number of such ancient relics.

Several Explanations

But to get back to Dr. Cleckley and Thigpen: as they say, "Now do men of learning and high intelligence come to accept and to hold with such stout faith beliefs for which there is so little demonstrable evidence?" The doctors go on to offer several explanations for the weird behavior of some psychiatrists during the last 30 years. As they say, men use jargon "to blur implausible concepts, and to convey the impression that something real is being disclosed."

I take my hat off to Dr. Cleckley and Thigpen, who had the courage to get up in a psychiatric society meeting and say what every sensible man must know in his heart to be true, namely, that much of psychoanalysis is highly implausible theory, and theory for which proof never can be adduced.

As I often say, in a lifetime spent largely in listening to the troubles and worries of nervous patients, I have never had a patient tell me of such things as penis envy, and castration-fear—which, as a leading analyst recently said, are the foundation-stones of Freudianism.
