Portland — (UPI) — Mrs. Henry Salmonson said today she did not believe that her husband would be harmed by Cuban rebels during the time he was their prisoner.

Salmonson was one of the first five North Americans released by the rebels, who captured 30 Americans and Canadians in recent days. Mrs. Salmonson said it was "wonderful news" and "a big relief" to learn her husband had been freed.

She said her family left there was little chance Salmonson and the other hostages would be harmed. The Salmonsons have three children.

## Object on Beach Said Not Polar Bear

Newport, Ore. — (UPI) — An object which washed ashore on the beach here on Sunday wasn't a polar bear after all, State Fish Commission Biologist Dale Snow said today.

Residents were startled when reports went out that a dead polar bear had drifted ashore. They couldn't figure out how one would drift so far south.

The object had appearance of a polar bear. It was about seven feet long and weighed about 600 pounds. It also appeared to have white fur.

But Snow, who examined it, said the fur turned out to be "connecting tissue" or a brittle-like substance. He also found no skeleton and concluded the object probably was part of a dead whale.
