

Ed Bouchee Socks Roundtripper In Season Debut for Phillies

One home run by returning Ed Bouchee did wonders—not only for his own morale but also for the Phillies, who suddenly are back within striking distance of the National league lead.

Bouchee, making his first appearance of the season, slammed a homer that helped the Phillies beat the Philadelphia Braves, 3-1, Thursday. It also boosted the Phils into a virtual fourth-place tie, only 5½ games behind the lead.

Bouchee was understandably nervous being in the lineup for the first time following his reinstatement to baseball after being involved in a morals charge.

"I was so nervous the first time up," he said, "I could hardly swing the bat."

It showed, too, as he took a called third strike.

"But I got looser as the game progressed," he revealed.

That was apparent by his eighth-inning homer off Carlton Willey, which followed one by Solly Hemus that broke a 1-1 tie.

Bouchee's roomie, Robin Roberts, held the Braves to six hits in posting his sixth victory against eight defeats.

Crowd Sets Record
A crowd of 36,485, largest ever to see a National league night game, watched the Dodgers and Cardinals split a twilight twin-bill at Los Angeles. The turnout raised the Dodger total at home to 1,018,287—and approximately 10,500 had to be turned away.

Southpaw Johnny Podres pitched the Dodgers in a 3-2 triumph in the nightcap after the Cardinals won the opener, 4-2.

Back-to-back homers by Dick Gray and Charlie Neal off Sal Maglie gave the Dodgers their first two runs in the fourth inning of the finale, and they added the deciding run in the sixth on Carl Furillo's single, an error and a single by Gray. Podres gave up nine hits in scoring his eighth victory, including Ken Boyer's 15th homer.

Sam Jones was credited with his fifth victory on the opener which was decided in the seventh inning when an error by Neal and a pair of wild pitches by loser Stan Williams enabled the Cards to score two runs. Norm Larker homered for the Dodgers and contributed three of their eight hits.

Rookie Blank Reds
Pirates George Witt and Roy Face combined in a seven-hitter that paced Pittsburgh to a 2-0 win over Cincinnati. It

was the third shutout tossed against the Redlegs in the last five games.

Southpaw Joe Nuxhall, the loser, didn't allow a hit until the fifth, and then yielded both Pirate runs in the sixth on Bill Virdon's double, Bob Skinner's single and another double by Ted Klauzewski.

Witt was credited with the victory, his second.

Ernie Banks ruined San Francisco's homecoming with his 21st homer of the season that powered the Cubs to a 4-3 triumph over the Giants.

Banks delivered the game-winning off Paul Giel in the eighth after the Giants had tied the score at 3-3 in the sixth on Orlando Cepeda's

double and Hank Sauer's single. Dale Long also homered for Chicago. Reliever Glenn Hobbie was credited with his sixth victory although he needed relief himself in the ninth.

Mickey Mantle scotched all that talk about him being in a slump when he poled two tremendous homers as the Yankees walloped Washington, 11-3.

Mickey, who had been having trouble hitting left-handed, socked his 17th and 18th homers while batting that way against right-hander Russ Kemmerer. His first homer cleared the 31-foot right field fence, 372 feet from home plate and was still rising

when it left the park. His second homer landed two-thirds of the way into the left-field bleachers.

Norm Siebern and Yogi Berra also homered for the Yanks while Jim Lemon and Rocky Bridges connected off

Landis' double knocked in two runs off loser Ray Herbert in the seventh and his single with the bases loaded capped a four-run rally in the eighth. Jim Wilson gained his seventh victory although he needed relief.

Joe Ginsberg's single broke up a marathon struggle and led the Orioles to a 7-5 victory over the Red Sox in 15 innings. The game, interrupted by rain, took 4 hours and 46 minutes to complete.

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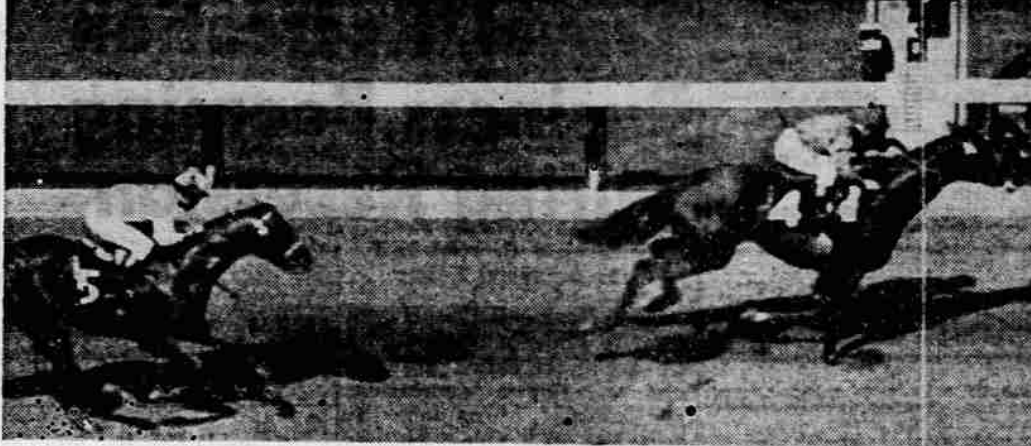
