Baltimore —(UPI)—Major league club owners turned baseball's annual All-Star "outing" into a big business meeting that ultimately may alter the map of the game.

They were playing the 25th annual All-Star game today but it was only a sideshow in the minds of baseball men. The big topic on their lips involved Monday's momentous meetings which made it plain that expansion still is the clubowners' favorite form of amusement.

Senator Says Ball Clubs Must Consider Public

Washington —(UPI)—Sen. Karl E. Mundt, a sponsor of a Senate sports bill, disclosed today he is drafting an amendment to keep club owners from "thumping their noses at the public" in franchise shifts.
