Corvallis — Oregon farm families have been invited to share their homes with youths from South American and Scandinavian countries this summer and fall under the International Farm Youth Exchange (IFYE) program.

Homes are needed for four IFYE's scheduled to arrive at Oregon State College Aug. 9, according to Mrs. Winnifred Fulmer, state 4-H extension agent. They are Miss Marja Virkkala, 29, Finland; Mr. Alvo Bergset, 26, Norway; Mr. Rodrigo Caicedo R., 32, Ecuador; and Mr. Porfirio Granados O., 25, Honduras.

Most families should be willing to accept the visitors as members of the family sharing work, play and community activities. Average stay with any family is three weeks, she said.

County extension agents help prepare families for visitors by providing them with information on their native countries, customs, habits and educational and family backgrounds. Visitors have been already oriented to American living habits in Washington.
