

604 Students Are Enrolled at SOC

Ashland — Present enrollment at Southern Oregon college totals 604 students according to Mrs. Mabel Winston, registrar. The total includes workshop registration and regular term enrollment.

There are 200 men and 384 women students on the registrar's rolls. The recent influx of women students has been credited to the workshop registration. Currently, SOC has three workshops in session. These include methods and research materials in art; methods and research materials in science; and the Siskiyou Music camp, which is a seminar.

Additional enrollments are expected before the end of the month as four additional workshop courses will begin prior to Aug. 1. A seminar in curriculum materials and one in methods and research materials in the language arts opens July 14. On July 28 two additional workshops will commence, one in classroom psychology, and one in diagnostic and remedial instruction in reading. As yet the registrar's office cannot estimate the total summer enrollment, Mrs. Winston said.

Of the 604 enrolled, 469 are students who have previously been enrolled at Southern Oregon college; 137 are new students, 60 of whom come from other states.

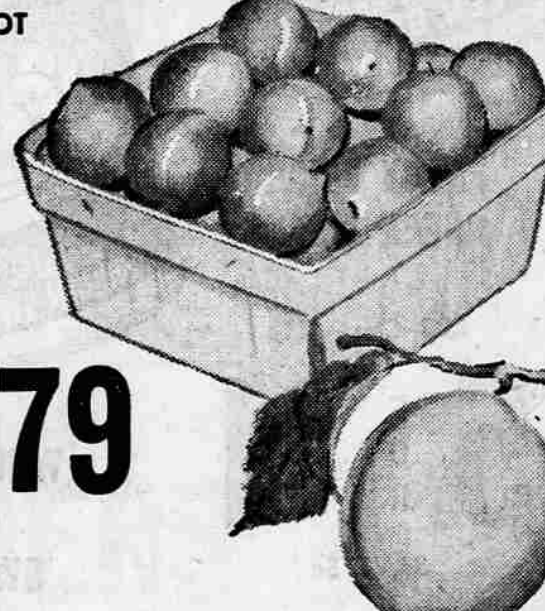
