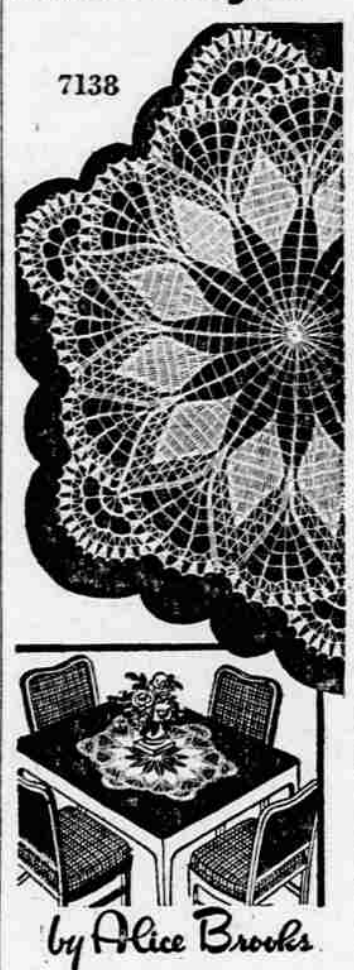

The Medical Roundup

Difficulties With Tranquilizers
Of late, physicians have been coming to see that tranquilizers, when given to office patients, do not always produce the miracles they often produce for patients in mental hospitals. Sometimes the office patient reacts wrongly to a tranquilizer and even gets excited by it.

This point was brought out by Dr. L. B. Kalinowsky at the recent meeting of the American Psychiatric Association. As he said, many an anxiety-ridden or neurotic person, when given one of the tranquilizers, gets more anxious than he was before. This note will interest those many persons who are now wondering why they cannot take tranquilizers. Years ago I wrote an article on the curious fact that many nervous persons cannot take a barbiturate or morphine or codeine. Instead of quieting them the drug throws them into an excited and very uncomfortable state.

New Hope for Gifted Children

One joy about writing this column is that, sometimes, when I tell of a great need for something in our civilization, good people write to say that something is being done to fill the need. For instance, of late I have been distressed over the fact that in our schools, the most brilliant and gifted children, on whom the future of our country so largely depends, must often be neglected while the teacher spends her time helping the children who find it hard to learn.

Then, in came kind Joe Berg and his co-director, Jacob Shapiro, to tell me of the Joe Berg Foundation and how this is underwriting all over the country—special courses for gifted youngsters. The new plan is practical and it is working. Berg is the type of able and dedicated business man who wouldn't be supporting the project if it wasn't working. He is one of the most delightful persons I have met in a long time.

At the invitation of the school authorities in a community, Shapiro goes and gets the teachers in the 9th, 10th and 11th grades to select the brightest students. These young people are then given a tough science aptitude examination, and those who score well and show interest are invited to come to the school one evening a week for a special two-hour, science seminar. This seminar is presided over by the ablest scientifically-trained men whom the school department and Mr. Shapiro can find in the community.

The youngsters are so bright that they keep quizzing the instructor. Their questions are a challenge to him and their interest keeps him so stimulated that he looks forward to each session. The instructor, who often is a research engineer or chemist, sometimes will take his class to his laboratory or plant to show them how research is carried out in "real life." How wonderful it is that, in our land, we have devoted men like this who will give so generously of their time to this drive to help our young people!

I can imagine how fascinating such seminars would have been to me when I was in my early teens. Already then, I was devouring books on geology, archaeology, and general biology, but I had no one to help me with these interests. How wonderful it is in those, my most formative years, some able scientist could have taken me into his laboratory and let me have a hand in his researches; it would have been one of the

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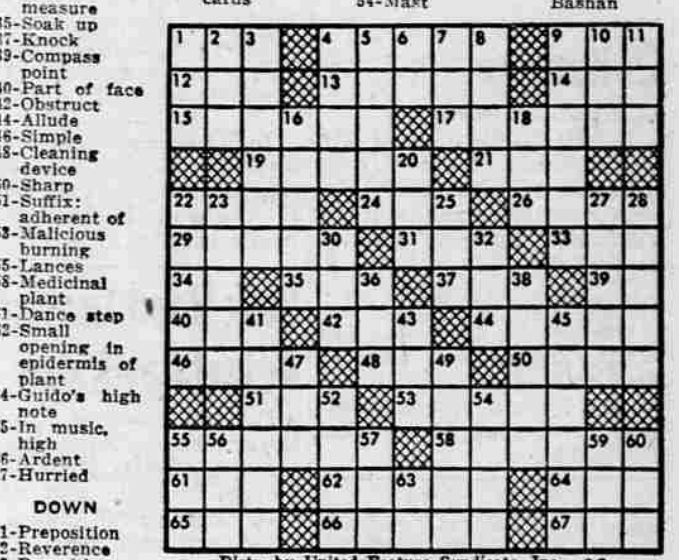
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CROSSWORD PUZZLE
