

Alan Holmes Gains RVCC Golf Diadem

Alan Holmes won the men's match play golf championship of Rogue Valley Country club Sunday.

He trimmed Ed Hall 4 and 2 in a finale which went 34 of the scheduled 36 holes.

The Sunday tussle followed a Saturday semi-final in which Hall edged Dr. Dave Boals 2 and 1. Holmes had defeated Dr. Bruce Stanley 1 up in an earlier semi.

After the first three holes of the titular match Holmes had a 2 up jump. Hall evened the count by winning Nos. 4 and 5 holes and went on top by nabbing No. 7. Holmes didn't pull even until the 19th hole. He then went ahead with a par on the 22nd. He took 26 and 30 with pars and closed out the match on 34 with another standard.

Two Over Par

For the route Holmes was two over par. He was two above regulation with a 74 for the first 18 and even par for the second trip around the links. Hall, who was 3 up on two occasions over Holmes, had one above par with 73 on

the first jaunt around. He was five over for the closing laps. Hall was 2 up after the opening out nine and made it 3 ahead with a bird on 10. The gap shrank when Holmes took the next two greens with a bird and par. But Hall birdie-parred 13 and 14 to restore the 3 up spread. However, Holmes won three of the next four holes and the gap was down to 1 up for Hall at the 18-hole pause.

On 19 Holmes evened. He lost 20 but got even again on 21 then jumped on top to stay.

Bob Phillips won the first flight final. He defeated Tom Teutsch 6 and 4. Ranny Smith claimed the second flight honors with a 5 and 4 verdict over Mike Hawkins.

Joe Brown Picked To Beat Ken Lane

New York—UPI—A lightweight title fight and heavy-weight battle for challenger's rights are the two big shows on this week's boxing schedule.

Joe Brown makes his fifth defense of the lightweight crown against southpaw Ken Lane at the Houston (Tex.) Coliseum Wednesday night. Zora Folley and Pete Rademacher fight at the Los Angeles Olympic, Friday night, for a possible shot at Floyd Patterson's title.

Each bout will be televised nationally — Brown-Lane, Wednesday, by ABC, and Folley-Rademacher, Friday, by NBC. The latter contest also will be broadcast nationally.

Brown of New Orleans, 32, is favored at 12-5 to beat Lane of Muskegon, Mich., 26, be-

cause of his combination boxer-puncher proficiency. Lane is aggressive, fast and durable; but he lacks the champion's explosiveness.

A crowd of 10,000 and a gate of more than \$55,000 are expected for the 15-round fight.

Streaks On Line

Each principal will be risking streaks in the bout. Lane seeks his 20th straight victory. Brown has an unbeaten string of 17, including one draw.

Jolting Joe will be making his fifth defense of the 135-pound crown he won from Wallace Bud Smith in August, 1956, and kept on knockouts over Smith, Orlando Zulueta, Joey Lopes and Ralph Dupas.

Brown's 70-15-9 record includes 32 knockouts. Lane's 42-5-0 list has 10 kayoes. Brown was stopped three times; Lane, twice.

In Friday's Los Angeles 10-round, Rademacher of Columbus, Ga., will try to win another shot at Patterson's heavyweight crown by beating high ranked Folley of Chandler, Ariz.

In Rademacher's first professional fight last August, the former Olympic champion tried to take the world title from Patterson and was knocked out in the sixth round. He hasn't fought since.

Folley is favored at 3-1 because of his greater experience. Should he beat Rademacher more impressively than Patterson did, he might get title consideration. His 40-2-2 list has 25 kayoes.
