**West Washington Closed To Logging**  
Olympia, Wash.—A shutdown of forest operations in virtually all of western Washington until midnight Saturday was ordered Thursday by the State Department of Natural Resources.

No relief from critical fire dangers was in sight and Bert Cole, state land commissioner, said long-range forecasts called for the worst fire weather conditions in modern Washington history.

The only areas which were excepted in the shutdown were Clark and Skamania counties and southern Cowlitz counties and southern Cowlitz county. Loggers in these areas were on a "hoot-owl" requiring them to leave the woods at noon daily.
