Couple Honored At Dinner Party; Visitors Here

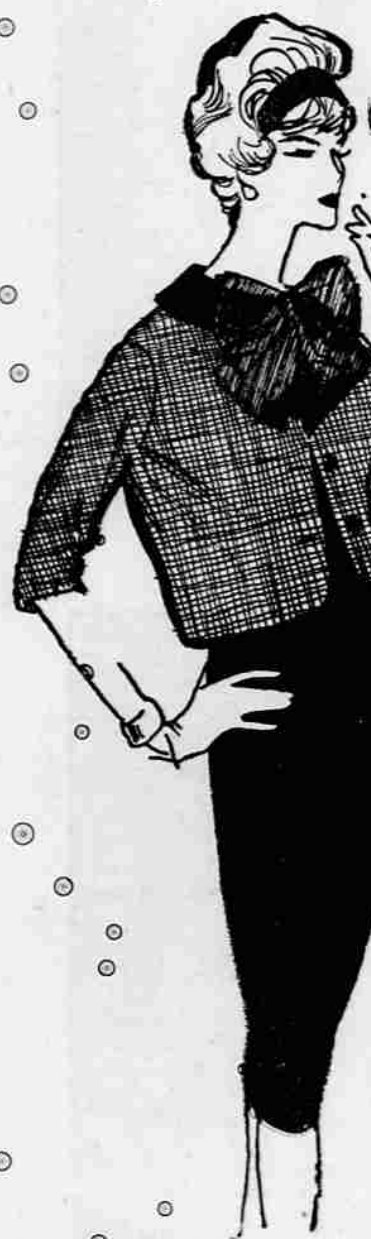
