**Butcher Wages Found To Vary**

Ames, Iowa — (UPI) — Iowa State College officials said studies conducted by the U.S. Agriculture Department show that there's a tremendous difference in how much a butcher's services cost as you move from city to city and store to store. The average butcher's wage costs about nine cents for

each dollar of meat. But in some stores the wage is less than a nickel out of each dollar, and in others it runs as high as 43 cents. Some butchers get special benefits such as uniforms, paid holidays and vacations, medical care and hospitalization, while others don't get such benefits.

**Heart Association Renews UO Grant**

Portland — (UPI) — The American Heart Association has renewed a \$4,400 grant so the University of Oregon medical school here can continue its study of the effects of anticoagulants on heart patients, the school said today.

The study, the first such project in the United States to employ the "double-blind"

research technique, is in its third year. The double-blind method is "designed to rule out the psychological effect on patients of a doctor's enthusiasm for a particular method of treatment," the school said.

Anticoagulants are drugs which decrease the blood's ability to clot.

**Last Rites Held For Harry Warner**

Hollywood — (UPI) — Last rites were conducted Sunday for Harry Warner, who with his brothers opened a theater in New Castle, Pa., in 1903, and built Warner Bros. Studio, a movie-making giant.

Mourners, estimated at numbering about 1,000, including top film figures, overflowed the Wilshire Boule-

vard Temple for the services conducted by Rabbi Magnin. The movie pioneer, who died of a cerebral occlusion last Friday night at his home, passed on during a year that saw the deaths of film pioneers Louis B. Mayer, Harry Cohn, Jesse Lasky and Don Hartman.

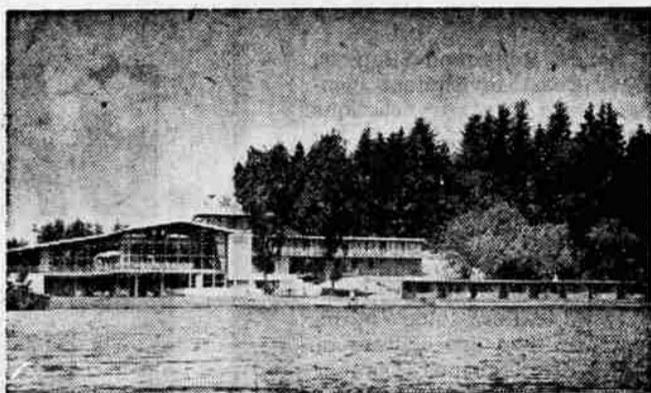
