Long Beach, Calif. — (UPI) — Beauties in the 7th annual Miss Universe Pageant turned their attention to Hollywood, television and Las Vegas gambling resorts today.

Not all of the 79 contestants in the pageant had landed jobs by the time the ball was over Saturday night but several had offers in show business by today. Not all wanted jobs.

Winner To Tour
Lovely Luz Marina Zuloaga, 19, the Colombia beauty chosen as Miss Universe, began her grooming at the Max Factor in Hollywood in preparation for a year's tour.

Miss Zuloaga collected \$11,000 in cash, a new convertible car and her expenses for a year in winning the beauty pageant.

Eurylyne Howell, the sweetly drawing 18-year-old southern belle, chosen as Miss United States, had been asked to make a screen test at 20th Century-Fox and Columbia Studio.

Considered for Part
Fox was reported to be considering Miss Howell, a tall, blonde Grace Kelly type from Bossier, La., for a part in "Mardi Gras," starring singer Pat Boone.

Screen tests were being prepared for a dozen other contestants. The Moulin Rouge, a night spot in Hollywood, planned auditions for contestants who want to try for spots in a new show to be premiered in October.

Resort hotels such as the Dunes in Las Vegas announced that the beauties had been asked to appear there.

'Breakthrough' In Cancer Battle Said Imminent

Washington — (UPI) — Dr. Le Roy E. Burney, U.S. surgeon general, says a "breakthrough is imminent" in the battle against cancer.

Burney, head of the Public Health Service, also urges all Americans under 40 who have not yet had Salk polio vaccine shots to do so before the polio season hits its peak.

Burney issued a statement Sunday on polio. Later he talked about the possibility of cures for several types of cancer "within a generation."

Voices Optimism
Whether the "imminent" breakthrough on cancer "means one year or five years, I don't know," Burney said. He voiced optimism "on the basis of reports from the National Institutes of Health and from throughout the country."

He said evidence has been brought to light which may pin the cause of some types of cancer on viruses. If this were true, he said, vaccines and antibiotics would be of help in fighting the disease.

In his statement on polio, Burney said there were 52 new paralytic cases reported last week—the highest weekly total so far this year and two cases more in the comparable week last year.

Some Nuclear Bombs Altered To Boost Radioactive Fallout

Washington — (UPI) — Defense Secretary Neil H. McElroy has informed Congress that nuclear weapons in the nation's stockpile have been altered in such a way as to boost radioactive fallout in local areas. But he denied that the bombs were deliberately made "dirtier."

In a letter to Chairman Richard B. Russell (D-Ga.) of the Senate Armed Services Committee, McElroy said some nuclear weapons had been given new fuses to permit low-level bursts when needed to destroy an airfield with a giant crater, or to demolish other installations such as submarine pens.

Local Fallout Increased
He said low-level explosions pick up dirt and make it radioactive, thus increasing local fallout. But he said total fallout was not increased.

Sen. Clinton P. Anderson (D-N.M.), member and former chairman of the Senate House Atomic Energy Committee, engaged in a heated dispute earlier this year with Lewis L. Strauss, now retired as chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, on this subject.

Girl With Chain Starts Endurance Test With Ike

Washington — (UPI) — Nine-year-old Angeline Clett started an endurance show with President Eisenhower today over a 10-pound chain she wants the President to unlock from her neck.

The difference was that the President was snug in the White House and Angeline had only a pillow between her and the concrete in front of the executive mansion.

Revised Audience
The Angeline said she would try to stay there around the clock and "see who can hold out longer," she or the President.

She had been refused an audience with the chief executive. White House guards have offered her the key she wanted to the President to unlock the chain. She says it is the only key, but won't accept it until she sees the President.

The chain is supposed to be "symbolic of the slavery" Angeline's mother, Mrs. Irene Smith Clett, went through to buy 700 acres of land in Texas. Her mother has been ordered off the land following a court suit but is armed and refuses to leave. She also claims to have succeeded from the union and refers to her land as a foreign country.

Angeline's aunt, Lucy Mayhew, who thought up the chain idea, has been sitting with her niece and handling diplomatic maneuvers with White House guards.

Four Abandoned Children Found

Portland — (UPI) — Four children, aged 4, 3, 2 and 1, were found by police Sunday abandoned in a filthy apartment in a four-family dwelling.

Police said no food was found in the apartment, and the children were unwashed; two of the tykes were naked, officers said.

The children were taken by Policewoman Eleanor Johnson to the police station for a wash job, before being taken to a nursery for care.

Police said a dependency petition would be filed today in juvenile court.
