

Prosecution of Goldfine May Take Two Years

Washington — U.S. Attorney Oliver Gasch said today prosecution of millionaire Bernard Goldfine on a contempt of Congress citation would take "a minimum" of two years.

Gasch, whose office would handle the case, told United Press International prosecution of a "hard-fought contempt of Congress citation in two years is considered good."

The House Commerce Committee scheduled a vote today on the citation against Presidential Assistant Sherman Adams' gift-giving friend—48 hours after the influence-investigation subcommittee recommended it 8-0.

House Could Vote
If approved by the committee as expected, the House could vote on the citation at any time and forward it to Gasch for prosecution. Subcommittee members have predicted swift, overwhelming House approval.

Blaze Destroys Barn at Albany

Albany — A spectacular fire swept through a big barn on the outskirts of Albany during the noon hour Wednesday while a farmer and his wife sat eating lunch in their home only 200 feet away.

A passing neighbor saw the flames leaping from the barn of Jesse Grieser and drove into the yard to alert Grieser and his wife. Grieser and the neighbor chased several cows from the barn and managed to remove some equipment before the blaze leveled the 80x150-foot dairy barn.

Heat was so intense from the fire that the Albany firemen could get no closer than 50 feet when they were called to the scene by Mrs. Grieser. Grieser estimated the loss at \$20,000 to \$25,000. Destroyed with the barn were 1,300 bales of hay and some farming equipment. An adjoining milk shed and milk machinery were also lost.

Silage in two large concrete silos was also damaged by the intense heat and flames. Grieser said the blaze may have been caused by a spark from machinery that failed to flame up until he had gone into the house to eat.

Crippled Plane In Safe Landing

Los Angeles — A Pan American Airways Stratocruiser carrying 58 persons landed safely at Los Angeles International Airport today after reporting a crippled engine as it neared the mainland from Honolulu.

The big passenger aircraft put down without incident at 7:16 a.m. (PST) with a Coast Guard flying boat hovering nearby.

The escort craft was requested when Pilot Capt. G. Langston feathered the No. 3 engine at 5:15 a.m. 300 miles at sea west of Santa Barbara, Calif.

The plane, according to radioed reports, sprang an oil leak in the engine and Capt. Langston cut its power as a "routine precautionary measure."

Cities May Compel Exhaust Fume Control

New York — Many cities may compel motorists to control the exhaust fumes of their automobiles within the next few years, an air pollution expert said Wednesday.

Dr. Leonard Greenburg, city commissioner of air pollution control, said automotive exhaust fumes could be legally curtailed by devices attached to cars. He told the 22nd annual conference of the National Association of Sanitarians such a device would be perfected in a few years.

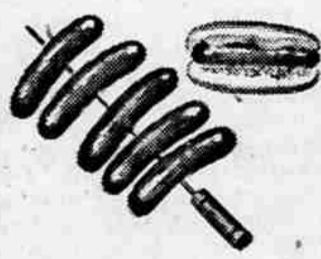

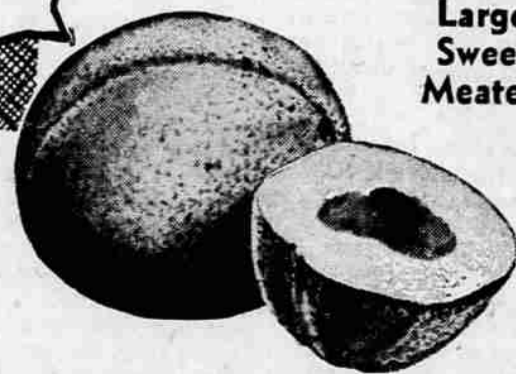
