

New York Assembly Has Record Crowd

A total registration of 180,291 Jehovah's Witnesses from 123 lands was reported for the Sunday assembly of the Divine Will International Assembly of the Witnesses in New York City this week by T. R. Thompson, presiding minister of the Medford congregation. Thompson is among a group of nearly 100 valley Jehovah's Witnesses attending the meeting. Wednesday evening he reported 7,136 persons were baptized.

The eight-day international convention is being held at the Yankee Stadium and the Polo Grounds in New York.

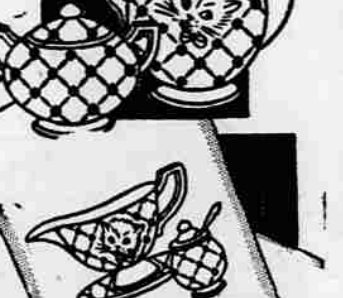

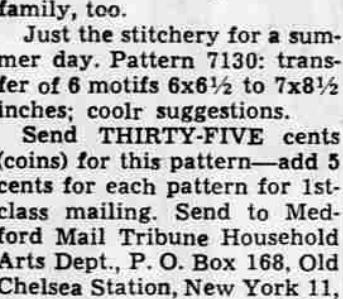

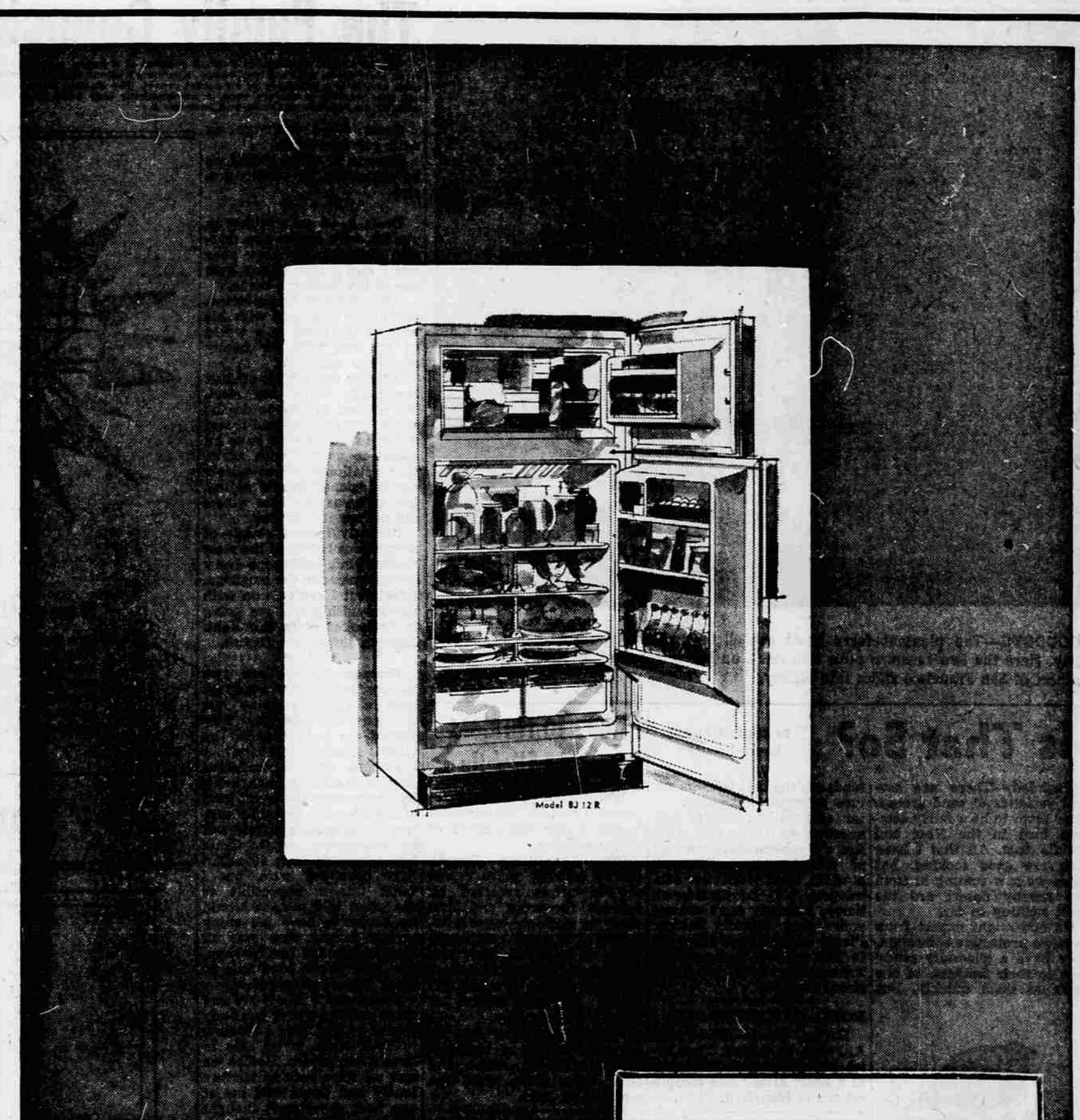
