De Gaulle Visits French Atom Center

Paris—UPI—Gen. Charles De Gaulle visited the big French atomic center at Marcoule Saturday and all but announced that France is building the atomic bomb.

It has been an open secret for some time that France is rushing to join the "atomic club"—now limited to the United States, Britain and Russia—but thus far no official has come out and said so.

De Gaulle, however, made a close inspection of the Marcoule atomic plant near Marseilles and said in a speech afterward: "I am thinking of what can be necessary for France's military power in relation to other nations."

Pilot Boling Leaves For Home Via Air

Pendleton—UPI—The record breaking air line pilot who doesn't want to "get into a rut" heads for home Saturday.

Captain Marion (Pat) Boling, the toast of the air world, left Pendleton air field about 3:30 yesterday afternoon and will fly—via commercial airliner, as a passenger—from here to Portland and then to San Francisco.

Boling will be accompanied by his wife Joyce and nine-year-old son, Kevin. The Bolings have two other children.

The handsome skipper wrote a new page in his air history book Friday as his brilliantly colored Beechcraft

settled gently onto a runway at the Pendleton airport.

Flying the "great circle" route from Manila, Boling set a new world record for a solo flight, covering 6,873 miles in 45 hours and 46 minutes.

The old mark, set by Bill Odom in 1949 was 5,273 miles.

Friday night, the happy pilot took his wife by the arm and went in search of the "biggest steak" they could find. During his near-two-day flight, Boling had nothing to eat except baby food, figs, and fruit juices.

The Beechcraft Bonanza which Boling piloted to his record was flown to the Beech plant in Wichita, Kan., by test pilot Jim Weber late Saturday, company officials said.

His flight wasn't all for pleasure, though. Boling received \$1,000 for reaching Seattle and \$10 for each additional mile—a total of \$3,140.

He said he will give it to a home town church in Palo Alto, Calif.

Phil McKnight, public relations officer for the Beech aircraft company, said that Boling had 11 gallons of gasoline remaining in his tanks when he landed at Pendleton. He left Manila with 403 gallons.

When Boling's craft rolled to a stop, he had only to say, "I'm sorry I couldn't take it farther." He had expressed some hope of flying as far east as Wichita, but his fuel supply ran low.

Beech officials said some fuel was lost over the Philippines and the Aleutians when fuel in the wing tanks expanded and leaked out.

The 43-year-old United Air Lines pilot took off from Manila shortly after dawn Thursday. He touched down at 11:52 a.m. Friday.

Four Airmen Are Killed in Crash

Colbert, Okla.—UPI—Four airmen—including a Portlander from Perrin Air Force base at Sherman, Tex., were injured fatally near here about midnight Friday when the car in which they were riding collided with another.

Another airmen and a civilian were injured in the wreck which occurred on U.S. Highway 75A about two miles south of Colbert.

The Oklahoma Highway Patrol listed the dead as Lloyd Wayne Hoke, 21, Portland, Ore.; Melvin Eugene Dennis, 28, Galena, Kan.; Jack E. Rush, Hamilton, Ohio; and Arvil Dale Gaither, Malden, Mo.

Injured were Bob Cass, a civilian of Denison, Tex., and Claude Herion, a Perrin Air Force base airman whose home town is Stone- wall, Okla.

Herion suffered critical injuries while Cass' injuries were termed serious.

The Highway Patrol said the automobile in which Cass was driving alone approached a pickup truck, and in trying to avoid hitting it, swerved across the highway and collided almost headon with the car carrying the airmen.

Moscow Drivers Get Gas Without Stamps

Moscow—UPI—Moscow car owners were able to fill their gas tanks without restraint Saturday following the government's abolition of gas coupons.

An announcement in the newspaper, Evening Moscow, Friday said henceforth Moscow motorists will be able to buy unlimited quantities of gas and won't have to bother with coupons. Elimination of the stamps apparently was part of the government's drive to streamline local bureaucracy.
