Lime Dressing
New York—UPI—A tossed green salad becomes a new flavor treat with this unusual fresh lime French dressing.
For 1/4 cups of dressing, combine 1 cup salad oil with 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard, 1/16 teaspoon white pepper, 1 clove peeled garlic and 2 teaspoons finely chopped onion. Let stand 1 hour, remove garlic, add 1/3 cup fresh lime juice and 1 egg white. Beat with a rotary beater and toss with crisp greens.
