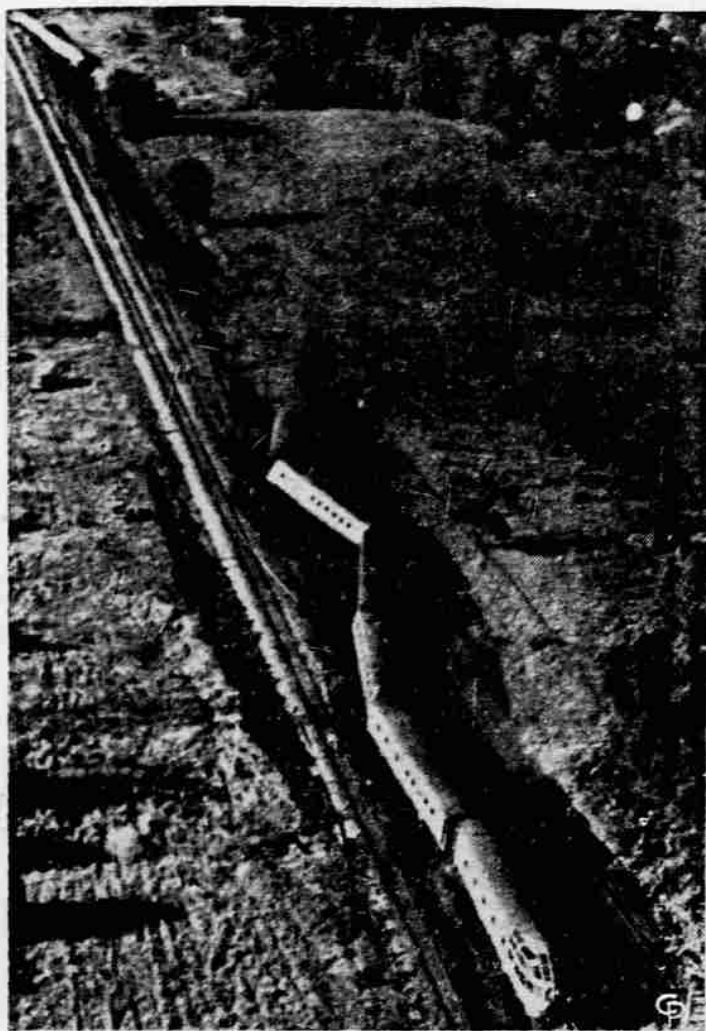

\$7 Million Budget Sought for Health

Portland—UPI—A budget of \$7,685,000 for the 1959-61 biennium has been approved here by the State Board of Health in a session that set a record for authorizing expenditures.

ton act funds for Dammasch State hospital and \$266,780 for three other proposed medical facilities in the state.

In addition to the Dammasch grant, the Board approved \$40,200 for the Portland Center for Hearing and Speech; \$143,580 for the Presbyterian Nursing Home at Ontario, and \$83,000 for the Creek County Nursing Home at Prineville.

Bulk of the Board's proposed budget would come from Federal sources but it still must be approved by the governor and the 1959 legislature.

Threat of Large Scale Jobless In Britain Becomes Alarming

United Press International—London —UPI—The shadow of unemployment gathered like an angry small cloud over Britain today.

It still is not on a scale to compare with the grim Thirties, when some two million Britons were jobless.

But for the first time in 20 years the threat of large scale unemployment is ringing the alarms bells in this country. Both government and labor unions fear Britain and much of continental Europe may be whipped by the backlash of the U. S. recession next winter.

The result, they fear, may be the highest unemployment since the breadlines and hunger riots of the early Thirties.

About 450,000 Britons, or a little more than two per cent of the nation's working force, are jobless at the moment. That still falls short of the seven per cent of the labor force out of jobs in the United States.

Labor Leaders Worried

But it is enough to flash red lights in government and labor union offices.

A worried deputation from the Trades Union Congress, Britain's largest labor organization, called on Chancellor of the Exchequer, Derek Heathcoat-Amory and warned that if the present trend continues there will be 750,000 jobless by January.

The deputation appealed to the government to prime the economic pumps and come up with a new budget in the fall in which it would increase its own spending, cut taxes and restore investment cuts. But the chancellor told him his first priority was to maintain the strength of the pound and keep prices stable. He refused to press any panic buttons for the time being.

Restrictions Eased

However, the government

earlier this year began easing the economic screws it applied last fall when the country was threatened with runaway inflation and bankruptcy.

The bank rate already has been pushed down twice from seven per cent to its present five per cent. A further cut back to four-and-a-half per cent is widely predicted. The credit squeeze on bank lending has been lifted.

Just before Parliament left

on its summer recess, the government lifted all restrictions on industrial building projects in areas where unemployment is above the national average.

Britons are worried because unemployment is beginning to hit the basic industries on which the nation's whole economic prosperity stands or falls—coal mining, iron and steel, transport, agriculture, fishing and merchant shipping.

Member-Load of Domiciliary Rises

The average daily member-load at the Veterans Administration domiciliary center, Camp White, for the fiscal year 1958-59 has been increased by 65, to 925, according to Banks I. Paul, acting manager.

During the current quarter the domiciliary will average 875 members, Paul said. The next two quarters the member-load will be increased to average 975, and the final quarter it will be reduced to 875 again. This fluctuation is designed to meet seasonal demand, according to Paul.

The increase, authorized by the chief medical director, Veterans Administration, Washington, D. C., does not require additional facilities, Paul reported. Furthermore, he said, the operating budget does not permit hiring of additional staff personnel.

Cloudburst Wrecks Railroad Train

Parkersburg, W. Va. —UPI—An early-morning cloudburst washed out two 20-foot sections of main-line Baltimore and Ohio Railroad tracks one mile east of here and caused the derailment of 35 cars of a speeding west-bound freight train Sunday.

Four of the cars, loaded with naphtha gas, overturned and burst into flames.

No one was injured, but the tracks were expected to remain blocked until Monday.
