Two Drown Off Newport Coast

Newport—(UPI)—Two persons were drowned and another was missing off the coast after they disregarded two warnings from a Coast Guard patrol boat and took their small outboard motor craft into strong tides and heavy fog here early Thursday.

Coast Guard patrols recovered the bodies of Edward Clayton Downs, 74, Newport, and Elsie M. Herring, about 50, of McMinnville. Missing was Edmund Edwards of Yakima, Wash.

John L. Cathers, commanding officer of the life boat station at Newport, said the three persons "chose to disregard" repeated warnings about thick fog and strong ebb tides and slipped over the Yaquina bar to go salmon fishing.

Air and sea search parties looking for Edwards have been hampered by fog, Cathers said the search was to be resumed this evening, but said there was no hope that Edwards would be found alive.

He said the missing man was presumed to be wearing a life jacket since the recovered bodies were wearing them, but pointed out that the low temperature of the water and the tides precludes any hope that Edwards might have survived.

Lumber Market Index Jumps \$2.64

Portland—Crow's lumber market price index shot up \$2.64 Thursday, reflecting the sharp rise in the market over the past two weeks. Crow's industry average index of today's prices is up 18 cent over the average a year ago. This is the first time an improvement over a year ago levels has shown up in the index since it was inaugurated in September of 1956.

All segments making up the index rose—green and kiln-dried Douglas fir, and western pine region lumber, the lumber news service said. Strong demand and limited supply of studs, dimensions and boards of all species accounted for the climb. Prospects for increased production, especially in British Columbia's interior, were seen Thursday with cooler weather and rain in some sections.
