

Boston Triumphs Over Yanks 9-6

Gene Stephens and Frank Malzone hit successive fifth-inning homers to spark the Boston Red Sox to a 9-6 victory over the New York Yankees Saturday before a crowd of 87,916 that turned out for the Yankees' annual "Old Timers' Day" celebration.

The Red Sox made it their day on both counts because their 1946 American league champions, although fat and funny, also beat the 1947 Yankee world champions who turned out to be just a little bit fatter and "fortyish."

Stephens, filling in for sidelined Ted Williams, connected for a two-run homer and Frank Malzone also homered in a rally that produced four runs. Dave Sisler, whose father, Hall of Famer George Sisler was seeing him pitch for the first time in the majors, received credit for the victory although he needed late-inning relief help from Leo Kieley and Murray Wall.

Mickey Mantle hit his 31st homer of the year and drove in a total of four runs to lead the Yankee attack.

Sherman Lollar drove in six runs with a grand slam homer and two singles as the Chicago White Sox crushed the Detroit Tigers, 9-3. Dick Donovan went all the way at

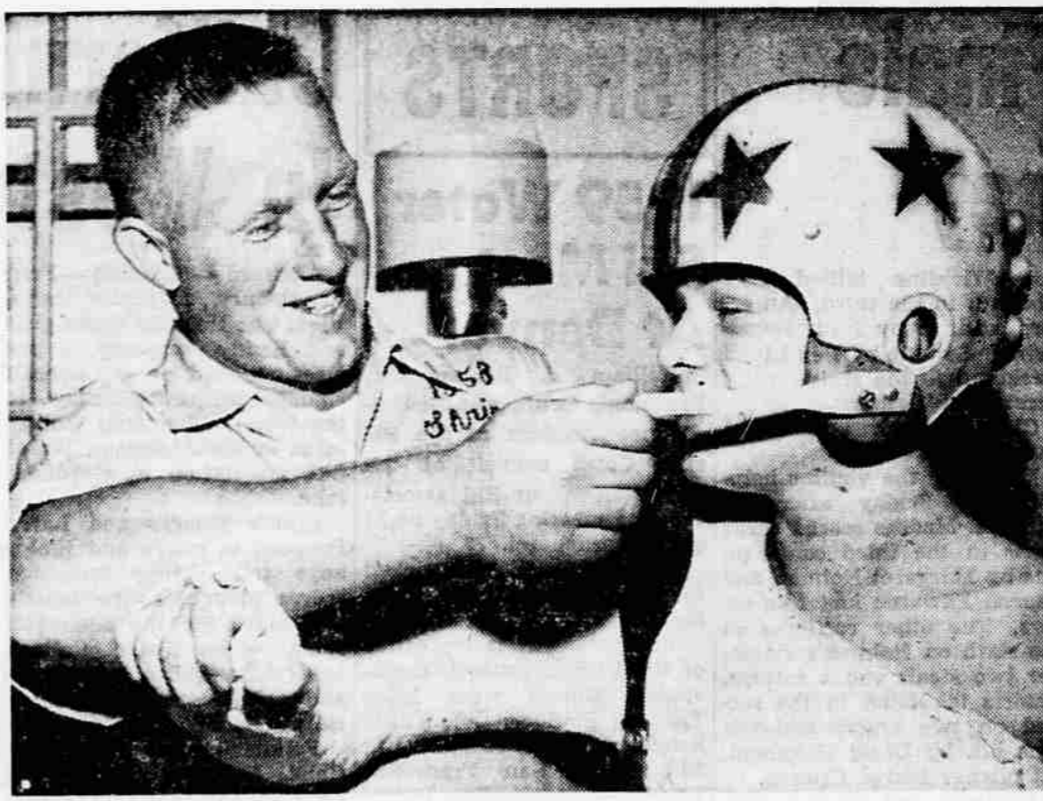
