Speed Takes Its Cut: One Third of Fatalities

Salem—UPI—Speed was directly responsible for at least 33 per cent of the fatal accidents and deaths during the first six months of 1958, the Motor Vehicle Department announced yesterday.

It apparently caused 49 of 147 fatal accidents and 59 of 178 deaths during the period. In more than 60 per cent of the remaining fatal accidents, speed was a contributing factor to death, the Department said. In at least 21 fatalities, drinking was known to be involved.

Pets Can Transmit TB, Scientists Warn

Stockholm, Sweden—UPI—An international scientists' committee warned Friday night that pets are a growing tuberculosis hazard to human beings. The committee particularly singled out dogs, cats, parrots and monkeys as potential sources of the disease.

The group, made up of experts of United Nations food and health agencies, is holding a five-day meeting to discuss animal diseases that can be transmitted to humans.
